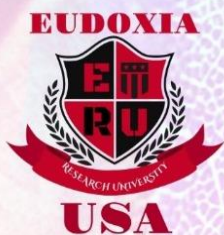

Keeping up with the vision and mission of MSI to provide platform for meaningful deliberations the institute along with its **IQAC and Research and Academic Growth Cell**, MSI organized one week FDP on “**RE-INVENTING EDUCATION PARADIGM IN INDIA**”. The FDP started with ceremonial lighting of lamp on 20th February 2023 in Seminar Hall 06 Ground Floor. Director MSI, Prof. (Dr.) Harish Singh delivered welcome address for the eminent guests and participants of the event. Sir further stated that it is the constant support and guidance of **Shri. Kaptan Singh ji**, President, Surajmal Memorial Education Society and other executive members in the management for organization of faculty development session like these. The dignitaries who graced the dias through their presence during inaugural session were: **Shri. Karnal Singh ji, Retd. IPS Officer, Former Chief of Enforcement Directorate (ED)** as the chief guest, **Dr. Tejbir Singh Rana, Professor, Shivaji College, University of Delhi** as **Guest of honour**, Shri B. D. Dabas, Chairman Finance Committee, SMES, Dr. H. S. Rawat, Director Placement, (MSI&MSIT) and Prof. (Dr.) Harish Singh, Director MSI.

Sh. Karnal Singh shared his valuable insight on “Indian culture, Spirituality and pragmatic knowledge for excellence In Education and research”. Sir emphasized on the need of promoting excellence by re-focusing on Indian indigenous knowledge and bringing consistency and discipline in one’s life. He focused on the dire need to imbibe humanistic qualities in the learners through the teachers by being true role models. Sir also reiterated that one should not fall into the trap of cut paste culture in research. Quality comes with experience. Sharing a recent development by Karnataka state where they have included a chapter on Rishi Baudhayana-the original mathematician behind Pythagorus Theorem, the speaker said that research is already there in our scriptures that we should read and reflect on. Further, **Dr. Tejbir Singh Rana** as guest of honour expressed his views and concerns on “Quality in Research”. Sir highlighted the major concerns in higher education and expressed his deep concern with respect to deteriorating quality of research. He said that the entire focus must be on value addition and quality education at higher level so that academic calibre can be rejuvenated. Sir further referred that for high global ranking of Universities in the world one of the important aspect is social outreach activities.

On day two, that is, 21st Feb, 2023 we had two eminent speakers, **Dr. Manimala Roy, Principal, of Basava International School, Dwarka** and **Dr. Rajeshwari Malik, Professor from Woxen University**. Both the speakers shared their valuable thoughts on the ways academic fraternity should work on preparing themselves for transformative education during Industrial revolution 4.0 and 5.0.

On day 3, that is, 22nd Feb, 2023 we had amongst us **Mr. Veer Sagar, Chairman of Selectronics** who shared his views on “Education for Job Creation” and **Dr. Ekta Bhushan Satsangi, Associate Professor, Delhi University** who shared her insights on “Aging Gracefully”. Dr. Veer Sagar said that we need to develop Learners as ALSO the job givers AND not just as the job seekers. So teachers should develop citizens as skillzines. He further added that there is a need of Promoting hunger for knowledge among students and the colleges must teach how to learn rather than what to learn. Dr. Ekta Bhushan Satsangi ma’am focused on self-care and self-love. She shared Common health conditions associated with ageing and how to take care of them. She said that our body and mind is the reflection of our choices in life so we need to take care ABOUT them.

On day fourth, that is, 23rd Feb, 2023 we had **Dr. Rahul Johri from University school of automation and robotics, GGSIPU** to guide us on “Evolving Education Scenario due to hybrid education in 21st century”. His whole address reiterated that Evolution of education is dependent on evolution of a teacher. An honest and passionate teacher who is also a researcher can do wonders for any nation by just not working for quantity but for quality in education and serving the society at large.

The valedictory session was on 24th Feb, 2023 and the chief guest for the valedictory session was **Prof. (Dr.) Arvinder Kaur, Dean, University School of Automation & Robotics, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (east campus)**. To give the session an auspicious beginning the lamp lighting ceremony was done by the eminent guests. Dr. Anviti Rawat, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce gave the welcome address and shared the summary of all the enriching faculty development sessions held till valedictory session. Further Prof. (Dr.) Arvinder Kaur shared her valuable insights on “Applications of Artificial Intelligence in Software Engineering” with august gathering. The session outlined the basic understanding about software engineering including software evolution. The speaker shared that software engineering is a discipline that develops and maintain quality software. Software engineering is the process of designing, developing, testing, and maintaining software. It is a systematic and disciplined approach to software development that aims to create high-quality, reliable, and maintainable software. The speaker further elaborated on Facebook’s and chat bots adaptation to Artificial Intelligence. The speaker concluded with the remarks that the ever-presence of Artificial Intelligent (AI) in many industries, ranging from consumer applications to business intelligence, making AI one of the giant powerhouses driving productivity, growth and innovation in the near future. Even that AI has been growing over the past couple of years, there are still lots of challenges ahead. One of the major challenges is that of cyber threat. This technology comes with certain responsibility one must remain aware about the disadvantages. The valedictory session ended with vote of thanks proposed by Dr. Kumar Gaurav from Department of Computer Science, MSI. Certificate presentation and Group photo of all the participants with the Chief Guest were taken in the end.

Thus to conclude, FDP assisted in developing insight into global trends, opportunities and challenges in Higher Education. The participants also gained knowledge with respect to the skills

required to keep up the pace with meaningful research and consultancy through international linkages, Industry interface and global cooperation. GROUP 10 (Roll No. 91-100)

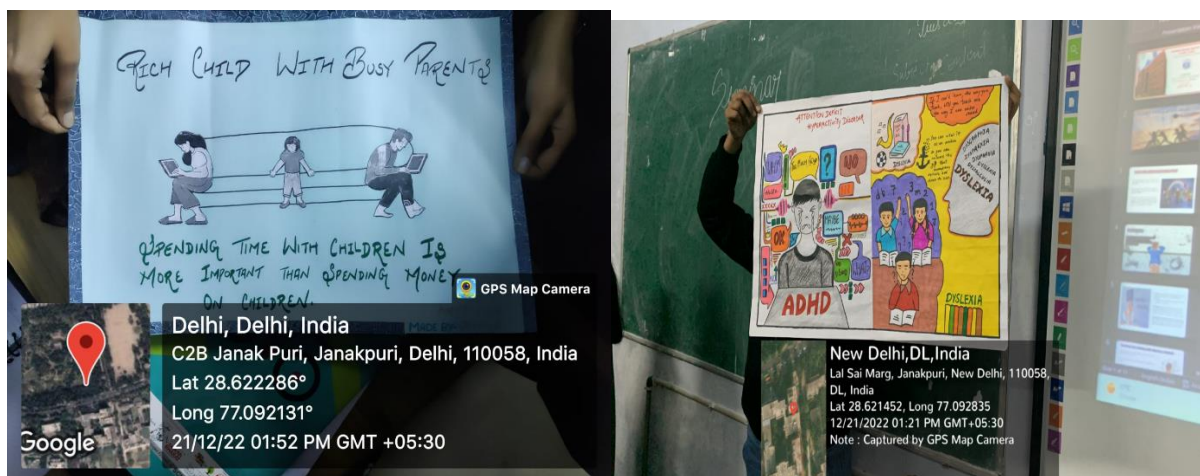

A special lecture was organized for the students of B.Ed. Department of Maharaja Surajmal Institute on 13th of March at 11 am. The guest of honor for the lecture was Miss Mahima, Senior Project Associate at IBM Skills Build. Ma'am began the lecture by playing an interesting game with the students. Then she introduced the concept of Design Thinking, i.e. a process for solving problems by prioritizing the consumer's needs above all else, to the students.

In order to make the students understand the concept, she had a discussion with the students about Inclusive Education- how they, as teachers, would ensure inclusivity in classrooms. She talked about how important it is for the teachers to ask the students (especially the differently abled students) about how they would like to be taught or which methods suits them the most.

She then correlated design thinking with the market and informed the students how important it is for the product to be designed according to the needs of the customers. She then delved deep into the topic of design thinking and talked about it as a human centered approach and the needs and interest of the customers. To enhance the understanding of the students, she kept on giving relevant examples related to the topic.

While concluding, she talked about the gaps in school education which means that what is taught in teacher training is actually different is actually different from what is applied at school. It would be the students' (audience) responsibility to fill those gaps and they can do it using the process of design thinking.



14. Report on Seminar on “Cyber Security”

16. Guest Lecture on “Importance of SWOT Analysis in a student’s life” April 12,2023

The students were seated by 10:55 am. Around 60 students enthusiastically attended the session. The lecture began with the speaker greeting the audience followed by an introduction. Since the speaker is a psychologist, she first began by knowing the audience. She asked various questions regarding various topics related to the life of a student such as studies, physical activities, regular breaks, etc. This was done to understand the perspective of the students regarding these topics and build a rapport with the students.

She proceeded the lecture with the topic of SWOT analysis. With the help of this, she ascertained the level of understanding of students regarding their strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. She told the students on how to assess their strengths as well as how to identify their weaknesses and turn them into strengths. She also shared her personal experience on how to identify various opportunities and how to grab these opportunities with maximum efficiency. Then she discussed various threats which students face these days such as excessive influence of social media and misuse of technology.

This was followed by a discussion about negative thoughts which arise in a person due to various surrounding conditions. The lecturer talked about how these negative thoughts have been rising in individuals in recent times, especially in the past 3 years. The main reason for these negative thoughts is the rise in fear due to the pandemic and the uncertainty it has brought with it in all the major aspects of human life, whether it is related to health or it is related to profession. She guided the students on how to identify these negative thoughts and take appropriate actions in order to reduce the effects of these negative thoughts.

The lecturer then discussed various case studies in which mental health was a central point and how it affected the various events which occur in those cases. She also shared her personal experience on how she dealt with various situations at various stages of her life and guided students on various do's and don'ts.

The session concluded with the speaker once again greeting the students and assuring them to reach out to her whenever they felt a need for it. This was followed by a vote of thanks given by Dr. Shailza Dutt and the session concluded at 12:04 pm.

17. A report of guest lecture on “orientation programme and interpersonal skills”

Objectives of the workshop:

1. To better understand the people around us, through identifying their issues and bringing modification in their behavior.
2. To develop soft skills in teachers and students.
3. To develop skills in teacher that help her handle the variable classroom situations.
4. To improve interpersonal communication amongst stakeholders.

The Department of Education of MSI conducted a guest lecture on “**Orientation Program and Interpersonal Skills**” for B.Ed first year students on 13 April 2023. The lecture was organized by **Dr Kusum Gill, Dr Arvind Kumar Gill**. This speaker was Ms. Preeti Sinha (counsellor) with 23 years of experience as a clinical psychologist, including providing NCERT counselling services. She helped the students identify the difference between a psychiatrist and clinical psychologist similar to the difference between orthopedic doctor and physiotherapist. She specified the role of counsellor as the one who write symptoms, confirms psychiatrist and then writes his conclusion. She mentioned the symptoms of an ADHD child. ‘Why interpersonal relationship is important?’ is the main question she focused upon. For this she helped the students examine famous personalities known for Verbal Communication, Listening Skill, Openness, Decision Making and Problem-Solving Skills, Teamwork and Positive Attitude. The answers like MS Dhoni, Priyanka Chopra, BTS, Manmohan Singh, APJ Abdul Kalam came forward. She made the students realise that these are most important skills for a teacher to have including critical thinking, leadership skill and ethical behavior and through Interpersonal Relationships Skills will help us Learn, Improve, Maintain. She defined counselling as a process is a therapy session that involves a trained therapist listening to the client and helping them find ways to deal with different emotional issues.

She emphasized on the fact that role of a counsellor is very important in schools, colleges or even in our society to draw attention towards multiplicity of problems faced by the students. A counsellor evaluate needs and develop treatment plans, listen to their problems and help them make effective decisions to

change their attitudes and behaviors. The areas addressed by counsellor are: anxiety, depression and other mental and emotional problems, family and relationship issues, career confusions and job opportunities. She also emphasised on what are soft skills and various types of soft skills necessary for teachers and students. Soft skills are a cluster of personality traits, skills, abilities and traits that pertain to personality, attitude and behavior for example, effective written and oral communication, critical thinking, information management skill and lifelong learning, problem solving and decision making, leadership, teamwork skill and ethical behavior was defined in her presentation. So ‘what instructional strategies are effective in achieving soft skills’ is the question that was asked by her and it is answered by following points:

- 1) Learning from others: through explanation and instruction (lectures, demonstrations, video, group discussions, online presentations, workshops and seminars)
- 2) Learning by discovery: guided inquiry instruction (research projects, literary works, theory and paper critiquing)
- 3) Learning by doing: like activities for application and extension of knowledge (on-the job training, community immersion, paper presentation, projects, event organizing, concept writing and publication)

The slides ended with a motto “Keep Going, Keep Growing!”

Report- A Guest Lecture was conducted by Department of Law in collaboration with Department of MBA on Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace (POSH) Act, 2013, Dr. Manleen Kaur was the guest speaker and the information delivered by her was very relevant and enlightening for the audience.

Being an important milestone in India, POSH aimed to address workplace sexual harassment of women. This law has enabled Indian women to stand up for their rights and assert their autonomy in the workplace. Dr. Manleen Kaur emphasised how the Act has sought to provide women with a safe and secure working environment and has put in place mechanisms to prevent and redress complaints of sexual harassment. She also highlighted on "Vishaka Guidelines" that were stipulated by the Supreme Court of India, in *Vishaka and others v State of Rajasthan* case in 1997, regarding sexual harassment at workplace, a landmark case which helped with giving rise to the POSH Act, 2013. She also threw insights on welcomed and unwelcomed behaviour at work place.

1. WORKSHOP ON MICROTEACHING SKILL ORIENTATION AND STIMULATED TEACHING 12th September to 24th September 2022

The department of education of MSI conducted 2 week workshop on microteaching skill orientation and stimulated teaching for **B.Ed. second year students (total 98 students)** from **12th September to 24th September 2022**. The aim of the workshop was to give students a brief knowledge, understanding, training and hand on experience so that they can give their best in 3 months school internship. All the teachers of B.Ed. department introduce the various teaching skills in front of students, like blackboard writing, stimulation variation, reinforcement, questioning skills etc.

On first day of workshop the **HOD Dr. Poonam Deniwal** oriented the students regarding stimulated lesson planning, timetable, how to make files and the points students should consider while 3 months of internship. After that **Dr. Usha Rani Malik** oriented the students about the most important skill of teaching that is blackboard writing, where she explained the techniques to use

blackboard effectively. After the short lunch break there was 2 hour lesson planning session, where students practiced how to write the lesson plan of both the pedagogies.

The next day of the workshop was tightly packed with the skills of teaching. Starting with set induction skill explained by **Dr. Promila Dabas**, **Dr. Kusum Gill** oriented the students about how they can make their teaching more effective, by introducing the skill of illustration. The students were quite active and they were asking their doubts that were impeccably solved by all the teachers. The next skill was explanation skill covered by **Dr. Monika Davar**, she used a teaching aid as well to describe how to use this skill. The next skill that was the skill of reinforcement that is an essential skill to make class motivated was oriented by **Dr. Monika Singh**, she explained its components and how to use them in classroom environment. A teacher is not just only give lectures to students but he/she also ask some questions that can enhance the thinking ability to students and there are some techniques of asking questions which were explained by **Dr. Vanita Anand**. **Dr. Arti Bahuguna** interacted with students, talked with them and through this only she oriented the students with the communication skill. While teaching it is very important to provide a closure statement by teacher so as students can get the idea of ending of topic and this skill of closure was explained by **Dr. Arvind Kumar Gill**. Charts, models, flashcards etc. are some useful teaching aids used by teachers to break the monotony of the classroom and make learning effective and interesting which was explained by **Dr. Rajesh Gill**. After a short interval of lunch break, **Dr. Vipasha** oriented the students with skill of stimulus variation to make class active and interactive and at last **Dr. Vivek Solanki** told some of the strategies on how to make classroom management effective. And with this the second day of workshop came to an end.

The rest remaining 9 days were based on stimulated teaching learning. In this the students were divided into group of 25 students and they were asked to deliver 2 lesson plan of each pedagogy of 15 minutes and get it supervised by the mentioned three supervisors. Also students have to discuss one lesson plan of each pedagogy, with their respective subject teachers. Moreover in total they were asked to write the 5 lesson plan of each pedagogy including the delivered and discussed ones. The stimulated teaching learning was arranged to provide students hands on experience of teaching in schools and giving them feedback on the areas they have to focus while teaching. Moreover special classes of smart board practice were also arranged by the department so as to make every future teacher compatible enough with the growing demand of technology in teaching.

And this is how the workshop of 2 weeks came to its end, which provided students plethora of knowledge of various required teaching skills, to make future teachers feel confident enough while facing the classes and most importantly to groom them with every required demand of teachers in society. The students were enthusiastic and much interested during the workshop and they took part actively, some bought innovative teaching aids, some were good with blackboard work. As no one is perfect and there is always a room for improvement so every student got feedback from peers and supervisors about their thrust areas and tried to improve their teaching skills.

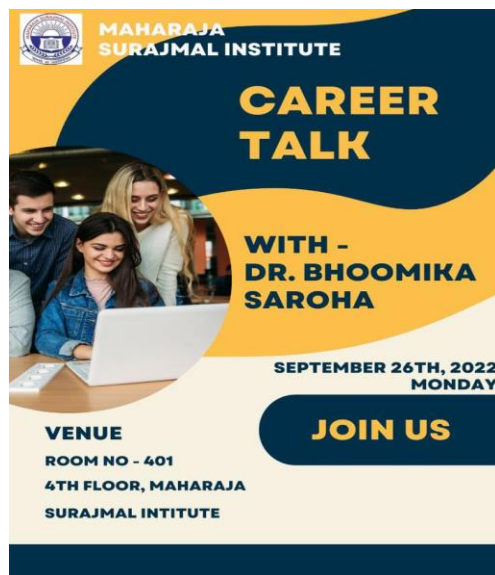

6. LISTENING AND OBSERVATION SKILLS November 16,2022

1) OBJECTIVES:

- a. To develop sound communication skills.
- b. To enable student teachers to be more conscious of their responses to experiences, observations of life situations.
- c. Learn to observe nature, people and situations around student-teachers.
- d. Learn to listen and observe multiple views on a variety of situations.
- e. Increase listening and observation skills.
- f. Use of observation and listening skills in partnership.

2) WORKSHOP IN DETAIL: The resource persons Dr. Poonam Beniwal and Dr. Promila Dabas initiated the workshop. The concept of the workshop was delivered by conducting 7 activities based on observation and listening. The activities were conducted by students in different groups.

- a. **Activity 1:** To tell the need of **observational skills**, a game act was conducted by the students. In this game there were 2 **almost** similar pictures. The viewers had to point out the differences between the two pictures.
- b. **Activity 2:** The other activity was a **guessing activity** which again emphasized on the observational skills. In this the pictures of famous personalities were warped together and the audience had to guess the pair.
- c. **Activity 3:** This activity was named "**Can you solve it?**". Here there were some riddles for the audience to solve. The riddles were quite tricky and needed the individual to trigger his/her observational skills to solve them.
- d. Before the next activity the presenters performed a **role play** to make the viewers differentiate between hearing and listening. They told some of the key differences between hearing and listening such as hearing is unconscious whereas listening is conscious, and much more.
- e. **Activity 4:** This activity laid emphasis on **listening skill**. In this there were a bunch of various games. Number 1 was a game in which if you hear 1 clap, 2 claps, and 3 claps you have to sit, stand, and hop/jump respectively. The other was a story which was repeated twice for the audience to listen and then a google form was to be filled by them. The last in this group was a drawing game in which the

orator was giving instructions, which were not to be repeated, to the audience and they had to draw a picture just by listening to those instructions.

- f. **Activity 5:** Here two teams of **3 players** each were made. The players volunteered from the audience. Here one of the members of each team had to be blindfolded and the other two were to give instructions to him/her in order for her to reach a particular point inside the hall. The twist was that the crowd can distract them by giving wrong instructions. The point of the activity was **selective listening**. The blindfolded members had to concentrate to listen only to their teammates and cut out the voices of the crowd in order to complete the task.
- g. **Activity 6: Two audios** from different movies and of different actors were played and the audience had to listen carefully and tell the name of the movies and the actors.
- h. **Activity 7:** The last activity was **Tongue twisters**. The tongue twisters were spoken at a high speed and the audience had to listen to them carefully and answer the questions that followed.

3) CONCLUSION:

- a. The activity insisted student-teachers to be curious and attentive.
- b. To ask good questions. Also the questions should be open ended and not close ended.
- c. Also, it laid emphasis on the importance of listening and observational skills in a teacher.
- d. The workshop made it significant that one should not jump to conclusions quickly and make sure to not get distracted from the past.
- e. The most important was that Children's questions are very important for a sound communication and an effective relationship and one should listen to them and never leave the children unanswered.



7. REPORT ON WORKSHOP : WORKING IN GROUPS November 23,2022

A workshop on 'Working in groups' was conducted on 23/11/22 in the Seminar Hall by the Department of Education from 12.30 P. M to 2.30 P. M. The Coordinators of the event were Dr Monika Davar and Dr Rajesh Gill.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP:

- ❖ Understanding working in groups
- ❖ Exploring structural situations that promote competition or cooperation such as participation in games.
- ❖ Exploring hierarchies and role-taking in group situations
- ❖ Exploring gender stereotypes in groups
- ❖ Facilitation of group working - everyone has a part to play and exercises for learning to work in groups.

The whole workshop was conducted in four sessions. In each session, a group of 25 students presented their views on the given topics. Each group had a different topic and pattern of representation. The groups were Group 1 (Kalaam House), group 2 (Patel house), group 3 (Radha Krishnan house), and group 4 (Manikarnika) which performed on various topics.

SESSION 1: GENDER SENSITIZATION

Kalaam house performed a skit on the topic of gender sensitization where they portrayed various scenarios at home and school where gender insensitivity has made its place without us even noticing. They pointed out issues like a boy not being allowed to choose teaching as his profession as it is considered a “girls’ job”, a girl not allowed to play sports and stay out late for her sports practice, a girl bullied at school as she experiences her menses during school hours, a transgender student bullied and not accepted by his class fellows as he was not “normal”, and other topics as well. The skit showed us how we are so casual about things which shouldn't be taken lightly. Gender insensitivity- a big no-no.

SESSION2:ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

Patel house displayed an act on the conservation of the environment. They portrayed various scenarios in which different environmental issues such as water scarcity, global warming, pollution, etc. They showed people fighting over water due to water scarcity, children not being able to go to school due to pollution, etc. Also, they conveyed the message that if we do not save the environment there are 100% chances that our earth will not survive in the future.

SESSION 3:VALUES AND ETHICS

Radha krishnan house portrayed how the environment affects the upbringing of a child. Here they showcased two children from different family backgrounds who have different thoughts, morals and values. 10. REPORT OF WORKSHOP ON ACTION RESEARCH March 25,2023

A workshop on action research was organized for the students of B.Ed. Department of Maharaja Surajmal Institute , as a part of paper BED 154 , wherein pupil teachers are expected to conduct action research based on different aspects of schools and school teaching learning based problems. Dr. Ahuja started the workshop by explaining the concept and applications of action research. He emphasized on the importance of addressing the problems and then analysing it to find innovative solutions for routine problems of a school like attendance, discipline etc. He highlighted the aspects of a teacher as a reliable figure as mentioned in the NCF 2005 and solving problems as and when they appear.

He talked about the humble beginnings of action research in the warzones of World War II and how it evolved to have diverse applications in areas like social administration , community projects , education etc. He discussed the key features and nature of action research, focussing on developing critical thinking in both teachers and students. He mentioned that there are three aspects which need to be focussed upon while doing action for research: provision of good quality education, good environment and focus on employment opportunities.

He explained that action research is aimed at solution of an immediate problem, with immediate application. It requires the identification of the problem in at least fifty percent of class as a prerequisite for initiating action research. He focussed on the six objectives of action research and the important reflections like involvement of practical problems , strong base in scientific procedures and application at classroom level. He discussed the nomothetic approach of sampling and that in action research the sample size is restricted .

Further he interacted with students on the relevance of the five operations of a school concept starting from attainment of the concept till conceptual enrichment. He elaborated the seven steps while conducting action research and the various domains. He used tabular representations in his PowerPoint presentation to explain: how to analyse the causes of any classroom problem under cause, evidence, nature and control and then on how to design for testing acting hypothesis under activities, technique, source and time required.

The workshop concluded with a question-and-answer session wherein sir answered various doubts and concerns of students like the role of children in an action research work and its relevance while preparing teacher lesson plans.



11. Workshop on Healthy lifestyle and Well-being March 29,2023

Department of Commerce of Maharaja Surajmal Institute organized a workshop on “Healthy Lifestyle and Wellbeing” on March 29,2023 at 11:00 a.m . The expert for the session was Mr.Arjun Verma, Sports Nutritionist, ISSA (U.S.A). The beneficiaries for this workshop were more than 100 students from first and second

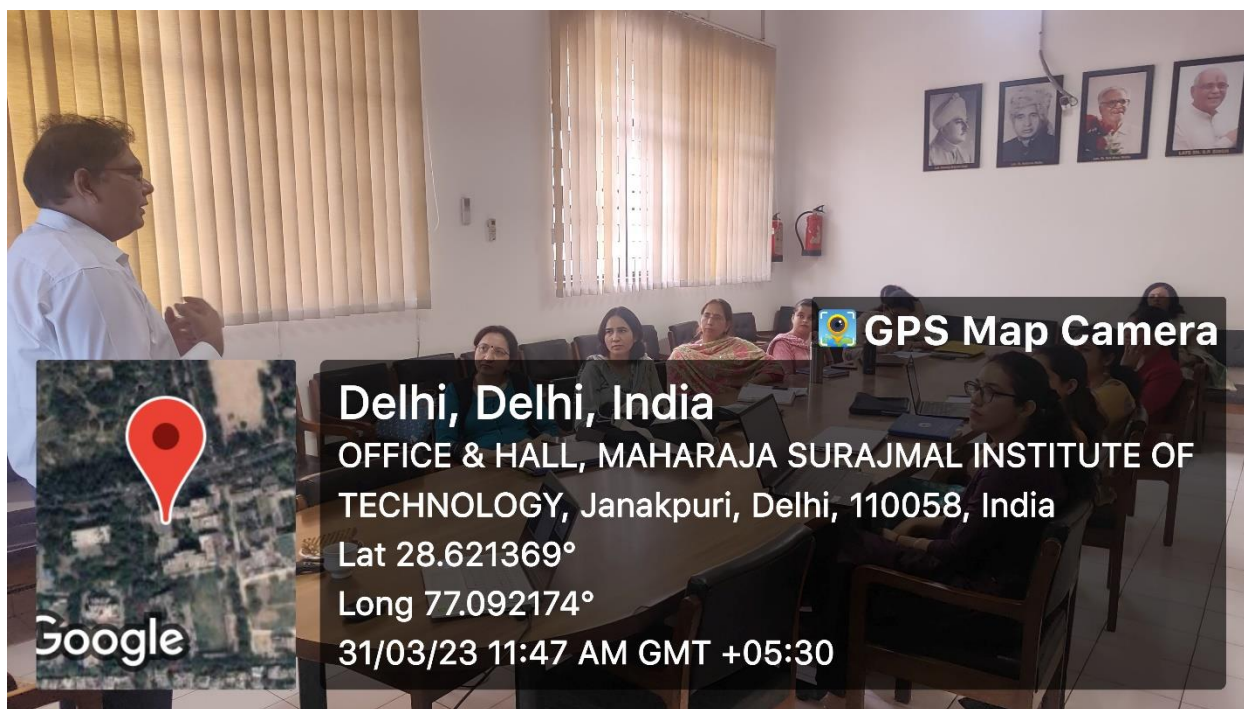


12 Workshop on Research Tools for Quality Publications March 31,2023

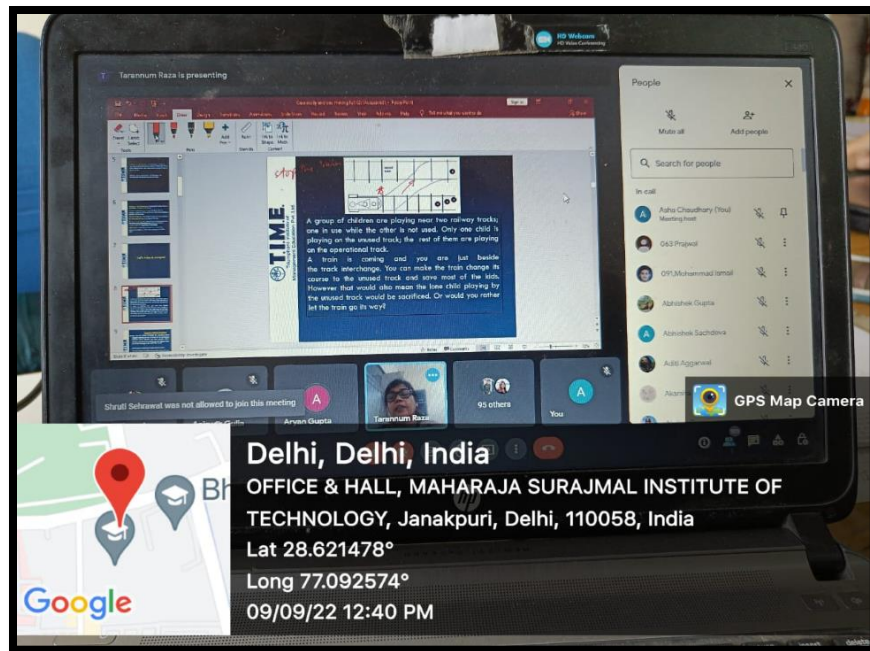

1. Guest Lecture on “How to do well in a case study(Mock Case Study)” September 9, 2022

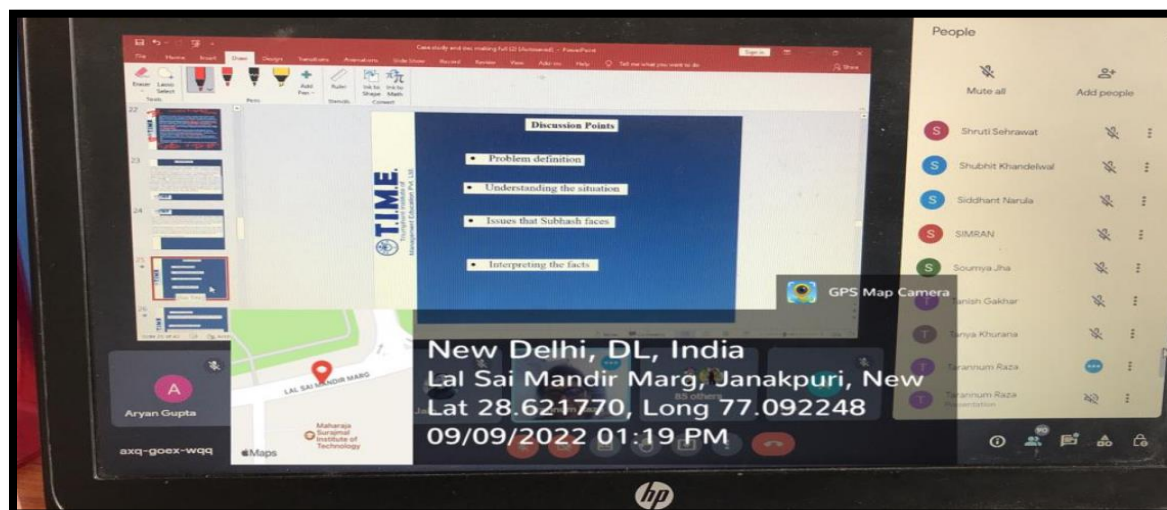

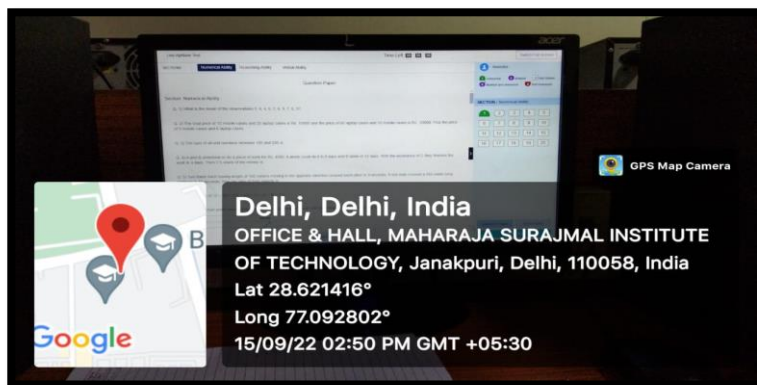


The first section dealt with numerical ability and included some basic math questions about data handling, arithmetic mean, permutation and combination, and so on.

3. Financial literacy and awareness programme

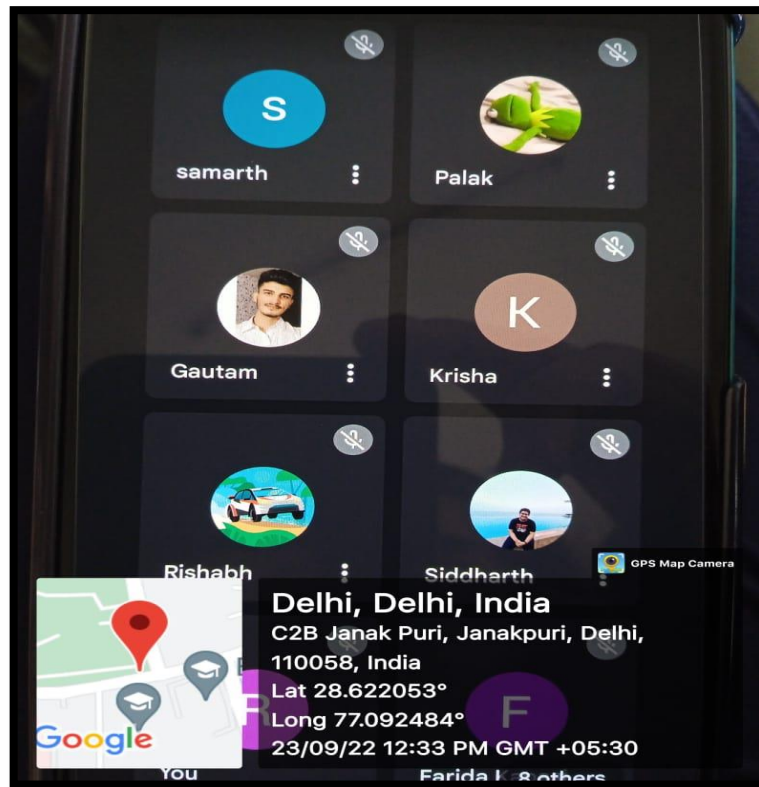

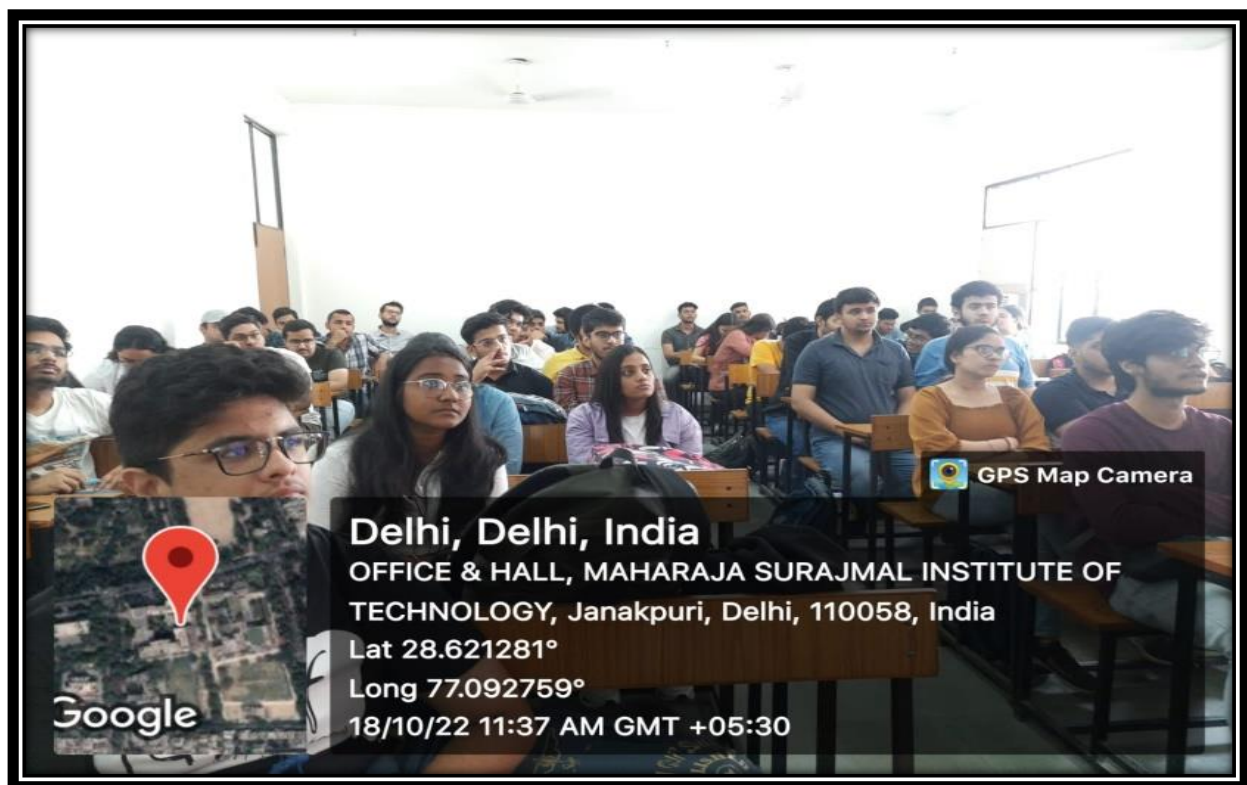
The speaker began the session by explaining the concept and significance of Personal Interviews. He further discussed how personal life and professional life are interconnected. Then the speaker delegated the importance of possessing personal interview skills. Further, the speaker took the students through the process of a personal interview.



Then he explained the steps that one should follow in order to ace personal interviews. These steps included discovering yourself, working on yourself, knowing what the interviewer is demanding and presenting yourself as the best suited candidate for any particular position.

Next, he moved on to shed some light on the preparatory aspects for a personal interview. The first and the most important aspect is the physical appearance of the candidate, particularly the dress code. The next aspect includes the initial impressions and the way a candidate enters into the interview room.

Subsequently, he told the students about the two most crucial questions asked in a personal interview. The first question is about the introduction of the candidate and the second question is about the strengths and weaknesses of the candidate. The speaker also taught the students the correct way of framing the answer to these questions.

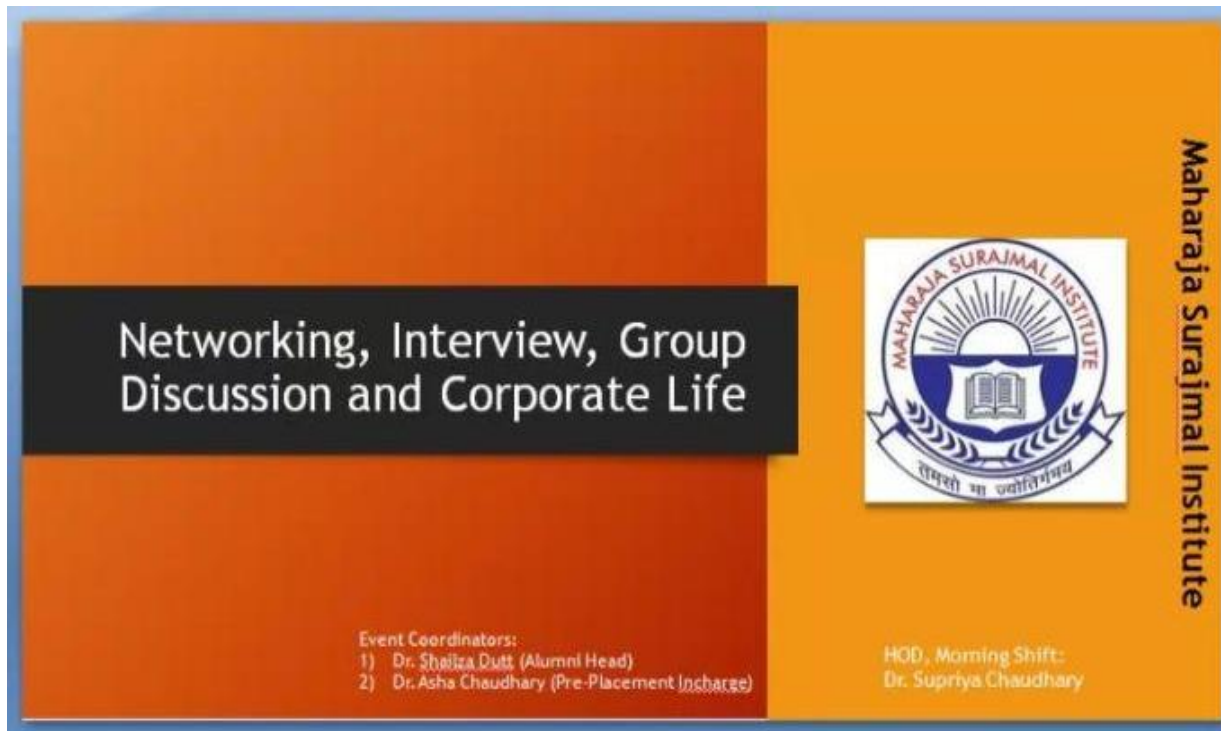

For each of the types, he gave some basic details like the way of conducting and the ideal duration. He gave some important points to be kept in mind during the interview, not interrupting the interviewer, not speaking casually, not walking around while answering questions, etc. Speaker also conducted the mock interview for the students.

Networking was the next topic taken up by the speaker wherein he discussed its importance and different levels where one could network namely, organizational level and personal level. He explained it further using a few of his personal anecdotes from his corporate experience. Next, the

Do's and Don'ts of networking were discussed followed by the process one should follow to network.

Lastly, the speaker discussed about corporate life where he emphasized using networking as a tool for growth. He also advised focusing on developing a distinguished skillset and always being vigilant to adapting to changes.

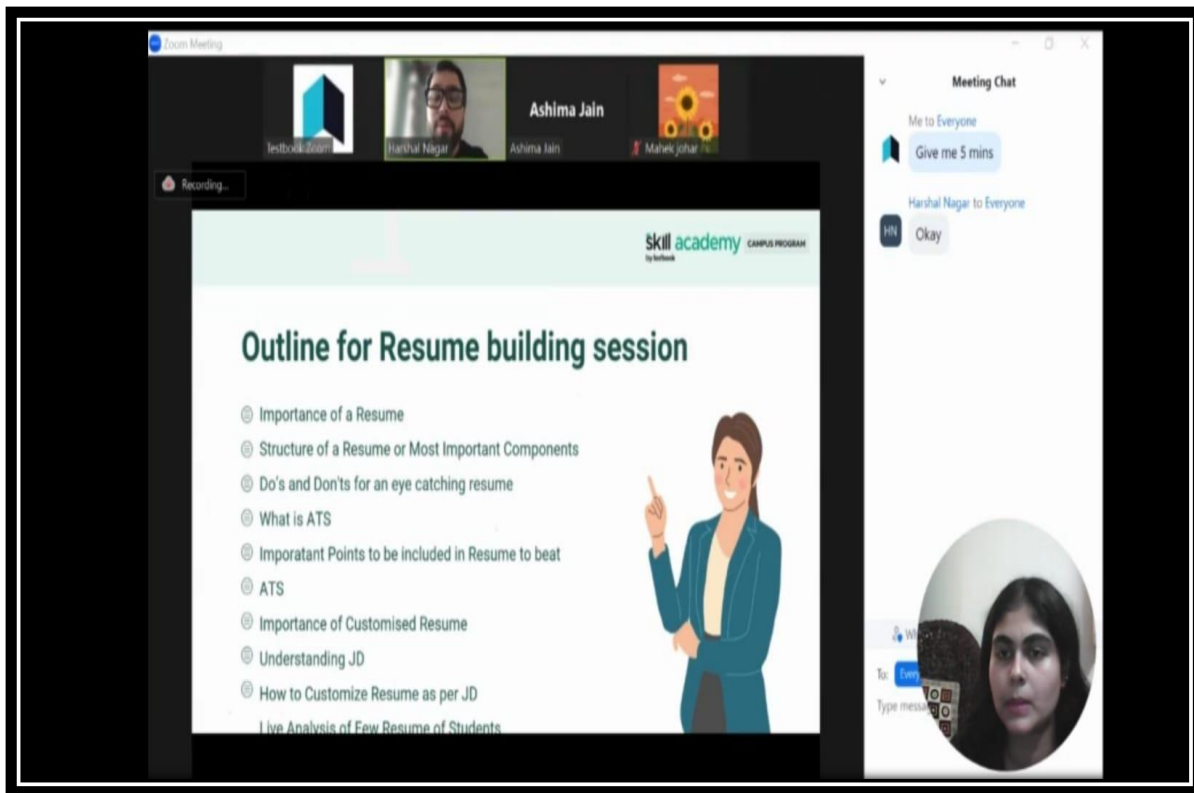

The agenda for the session revolved around topics like the structure of a resume, customized resume and the significance of understanding Job description.

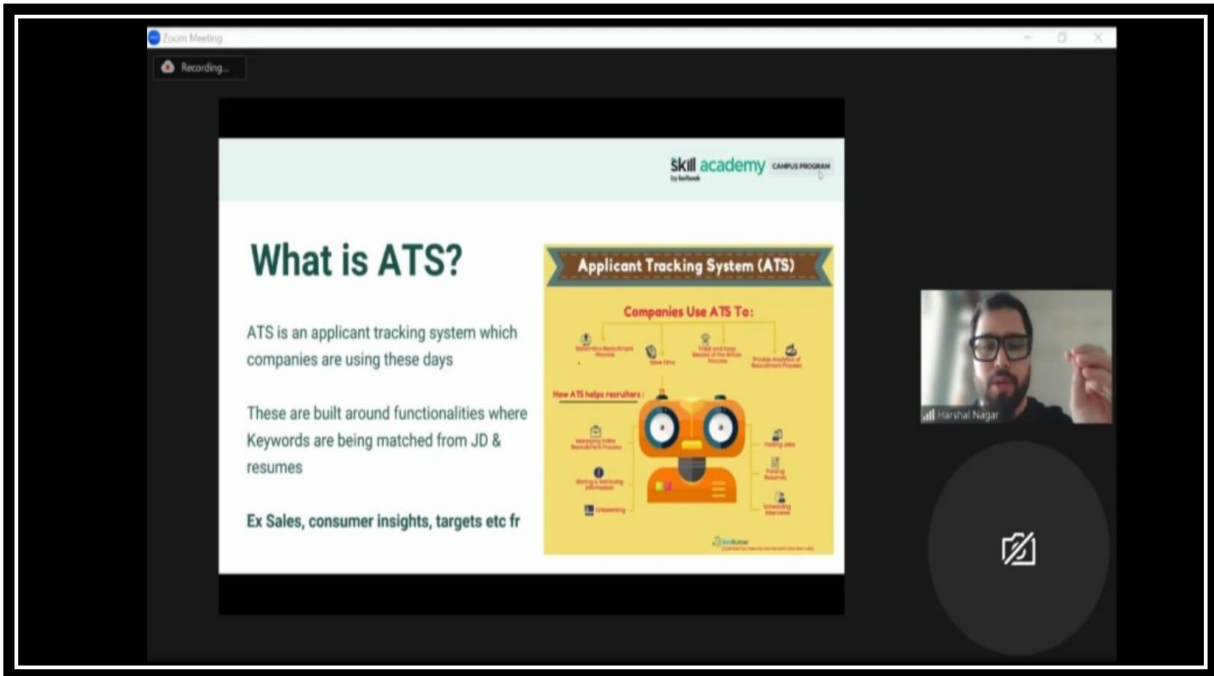

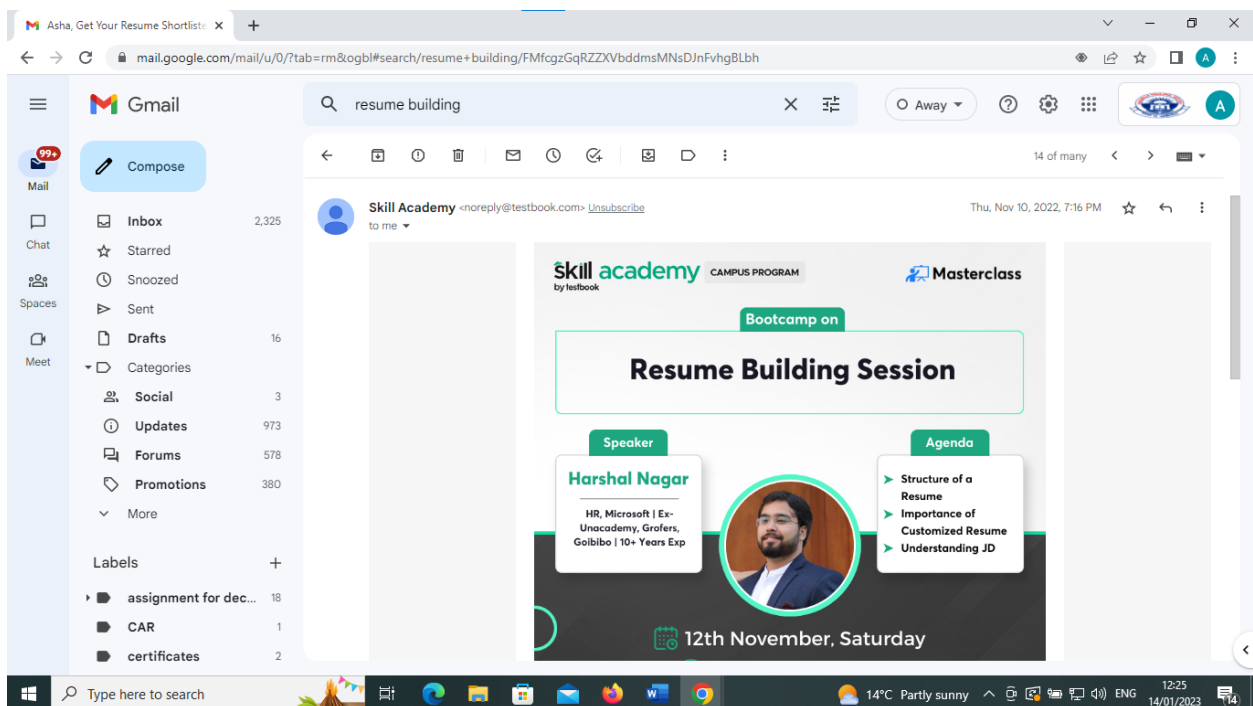

The session was very interactive throughout and the speaker kept taking doubts of the students throughout, and thus the session turned out to be immensely productive.



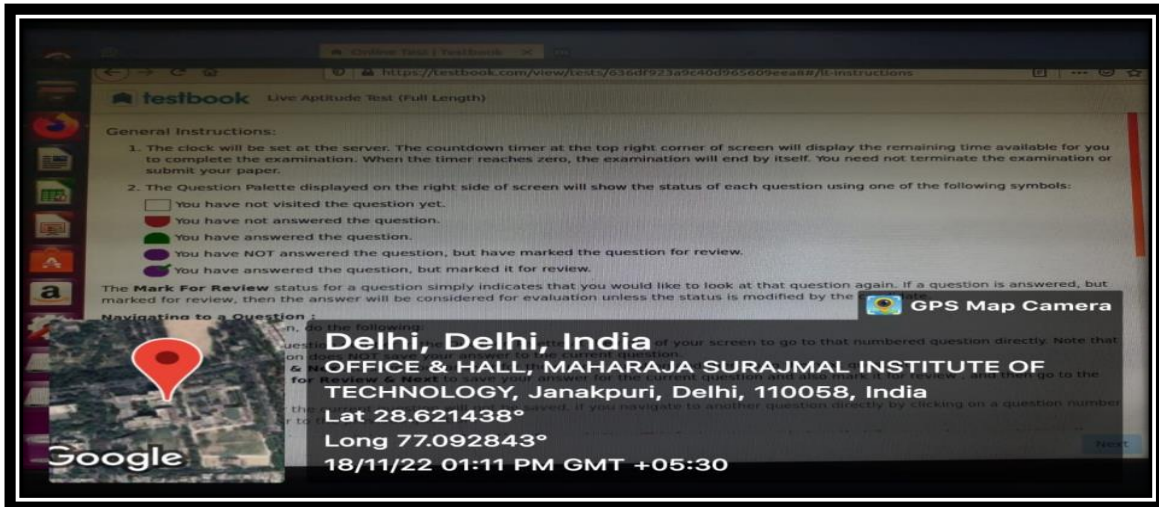
11. Live Aptitude Test (November 15-18, 2022)

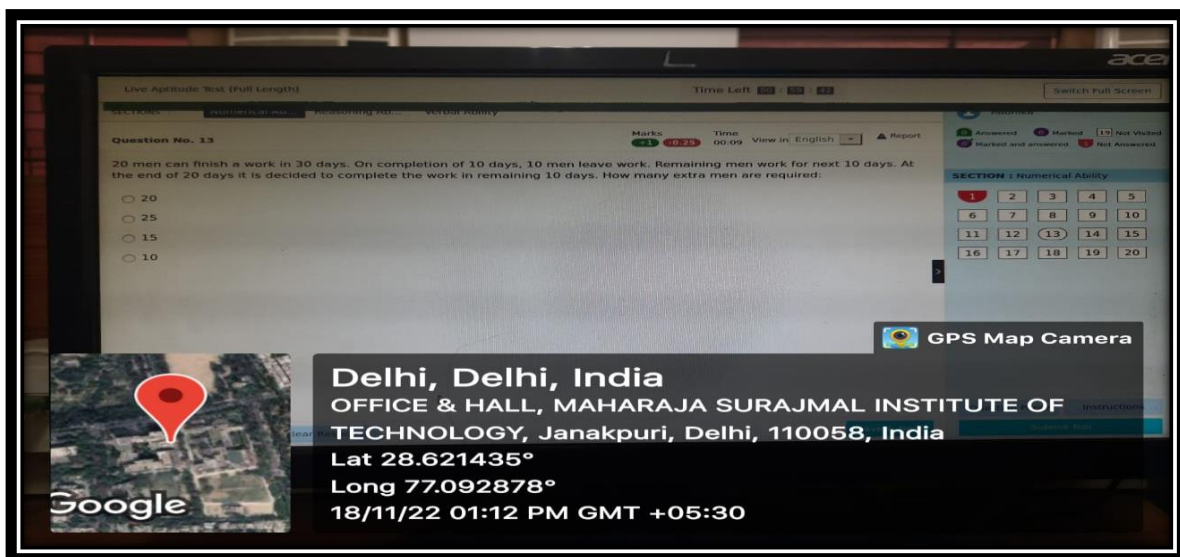


Students were supposed to click on the test link and then log in with their mobile number before the test began.

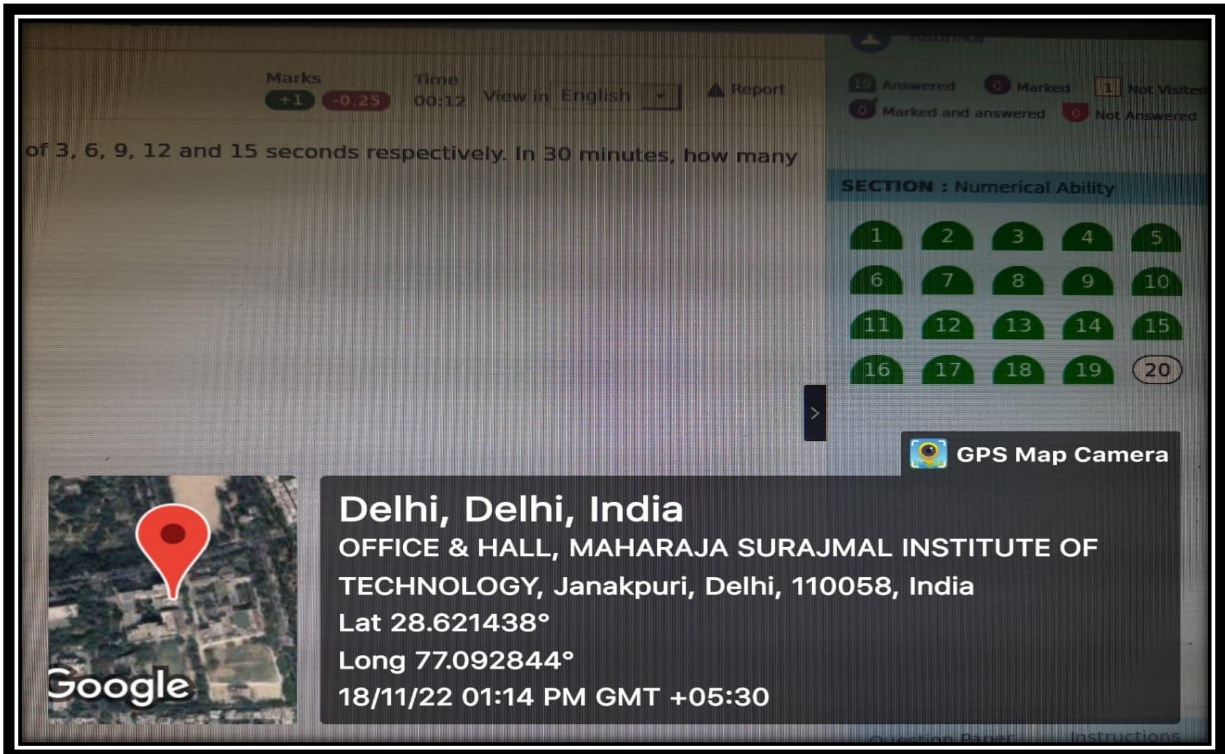

The first section dealt with numerical ability and included some basic math questions about data handling, arithmetic mean, permutation and combination, and so on. The second section dealt with reasoning ability, specifically logical reasoning, and included questions about coding-decoding, blood relations, reasoning analogies, and so on. The third and final section was about verbal ability, and it included general English questions.



Students were supposed to submit the test after answering the questions. After they submit the tests, they receive the marks and an analysis of their performance, which helps them identify their weaknesses and strengths.

On November 21st, 2022 Maharaja Surajmal Insitute organized a industrial visit to Yakult India's factory located in Rai, Sonipat, Haryana. The Guest Speaker for the workshop was **Mr. Tushar Kumar**, who guided the students about the history of Probiotics, Yakult, its manufacturing process, distribution, marketing and advertising.



He highlighted that Dr. Minoru Shirota, a scientist from Japan became the first one in the world to succeed in culturing a strain of Lactic acid bacteria beneficial in

human health and brought to the notice among the students that Yakult has 6.5 billion beneficial bacteria (*Lactobacillus* strain Shirota). Mr. Tushar also brought into notice the pricing strategies and variety that needs to be taken care of in order to build customer satisfaction and loyalty.

He highlighted the process of manufacturing Yakult and explained students about the benefits of it. He explained in detail the various factors and guidelines needed to be taken care of during manufacturing of an edible commodity. He told the students how they take care of the LCS Safety of Yakult, that is, GRAS from US FDA, FSSAI product approval in India and FOSHU (Food for Specified Health Uses) in Japan. He explained the marketing strategies used by Yakult and how they make it available in retail stores and hotels across India. He also informed students about the globalization strategy of Yakult and how it has successfully operating in 40+ countries and is looking forward to expanding more.

14. Eco-Environmental Visit to Neela Hauz Bio Diversity Park

Dated: 24th November, 2022

The Department of Business Administration Shift I & Shift II organize **an Eco-Environmental visit for the students of BBA III Semester to Neela Hauz Biodiversity Park**, Near Vasant Vihar, New Delhi, on 24th November 2022. The Faculty organizers for the visit are: Dr. Heramb Nayak & Mr. Ajay Phogat. The Neela Hauz Biodiversity Park is located on the South Central Ridge and Northwest of Vasant Vihar, is the massive 692 acre and supports more than 1,500 plant and animal species. At Neela Hauz Biodiversity Park the wastewater treatment in the filter bed of constructed wetlands is the result of complex interactions between Sediment, sand bed, Root zone, and water in pores, Litter, detritus (non-living particulate organic material, such as leaf litter), water, air, plants and plant roots, biomass zones, such as bacteria growing in sand and attached to roots. A mosaic of sites with different oxygen levels exists in constructed wetlands, which triggers diverse degradation and removal processes. Biodiversity parks with their rich flora and fauna, managed and developed using scientific expertise

are ideal instruments for promoting conservation education that will ultimately have a positive impact on environment quality and conservation ethics.. The visit to the park help the students in their subject of “**Environmental Studies**” as it is the part of their curriculum.

Dr. Dinesh (Field Biologist) educated our group. The students enjoyed the visit and learned the basic concepts about the environment species and the management of biodiversity parks especially in the metropolitan cities. The visit was very informative, students are led through the park on a predetermined nature trail and they gain knowledge on environment, sustainable development and conservation of flora and fauna at a primary, secondary and tertiary level. 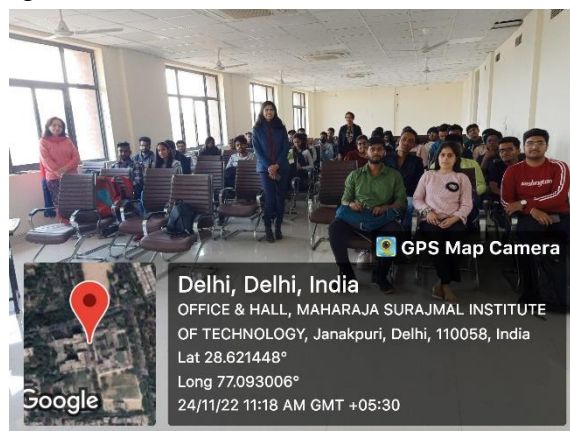

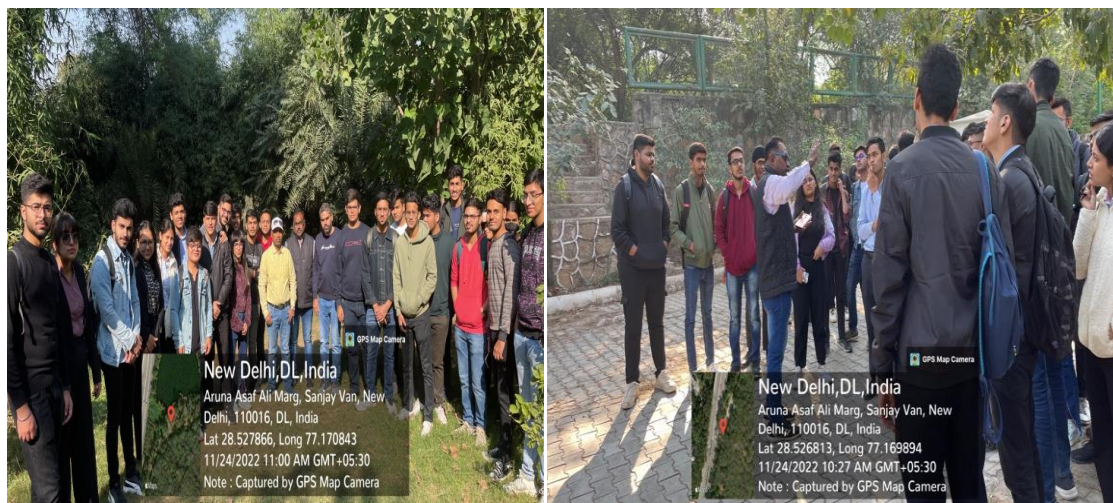

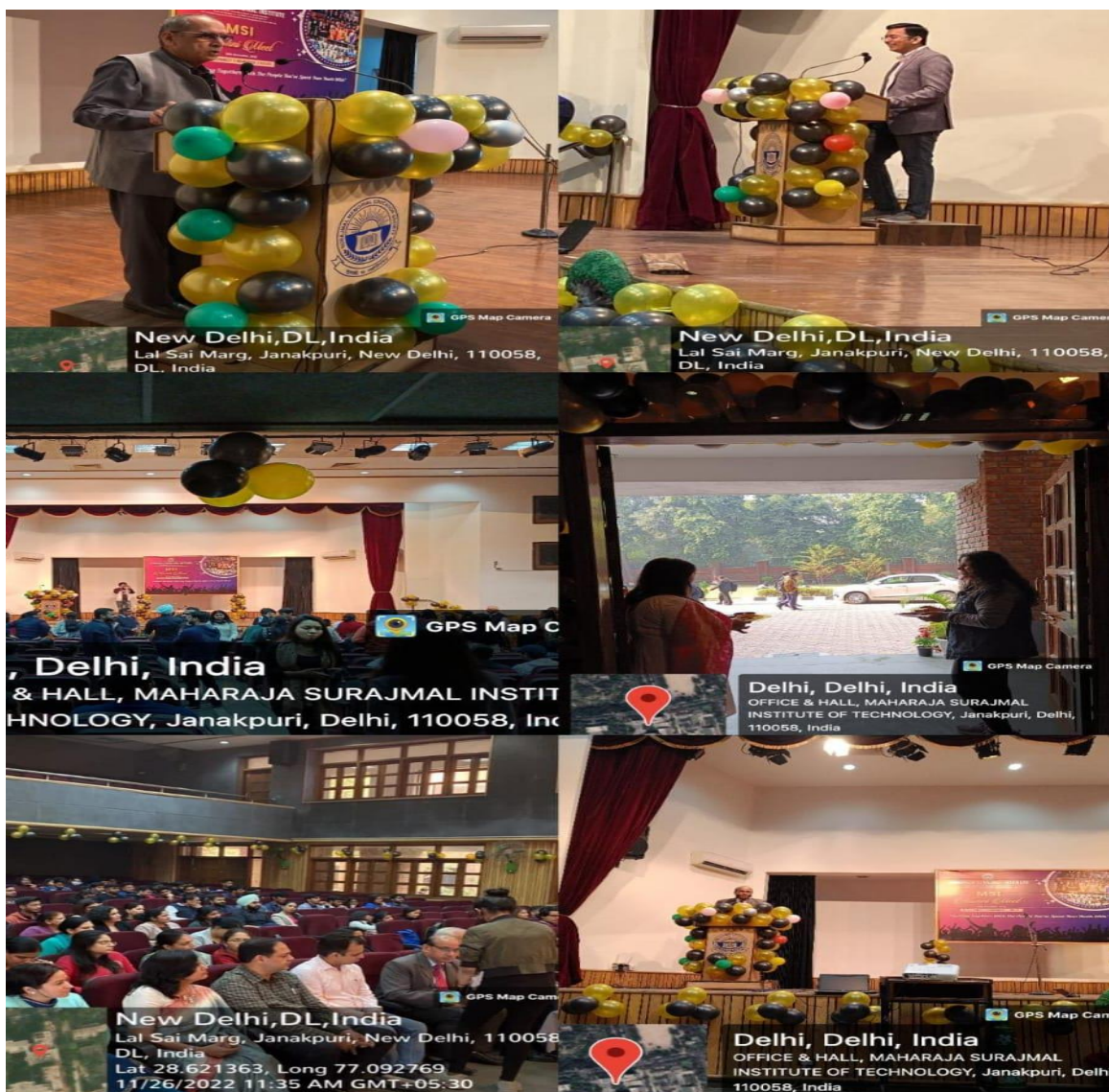
19. ALUMNI MEETING REPORT – 2022

20. Workshop on Microsoft Excel (November 26, 2022)

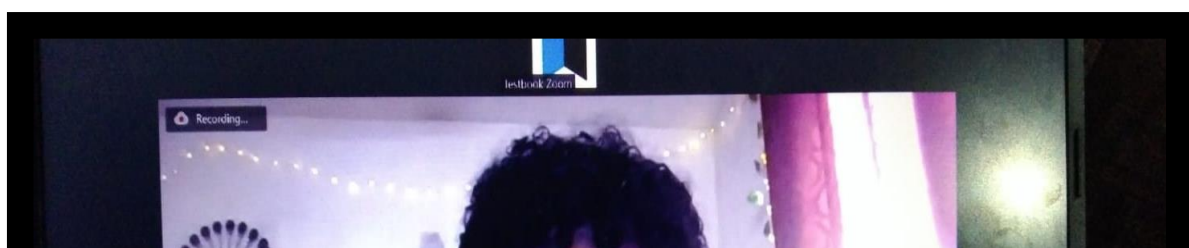

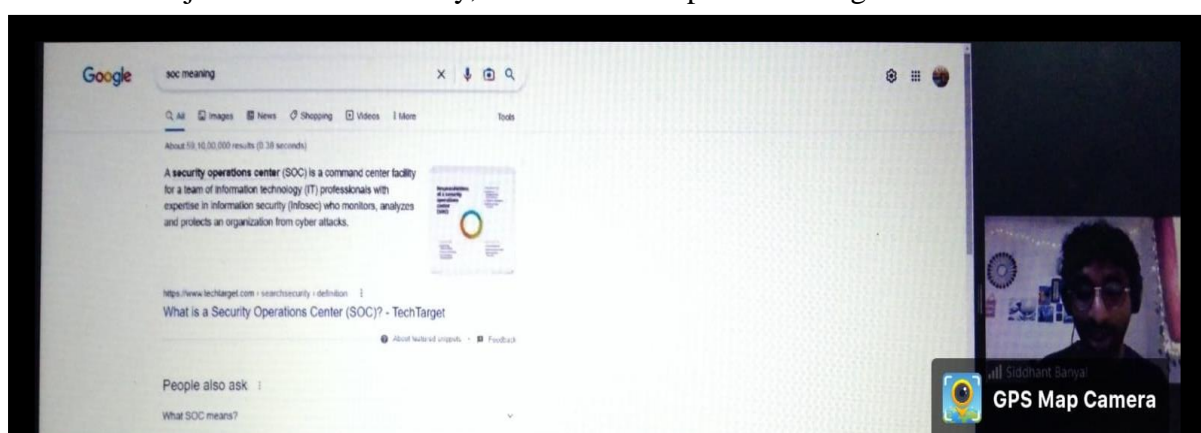

5. **Watch your body language:** Try to make use of positive gestures while interacting with others. This shows that you're at ease while having a discussion.

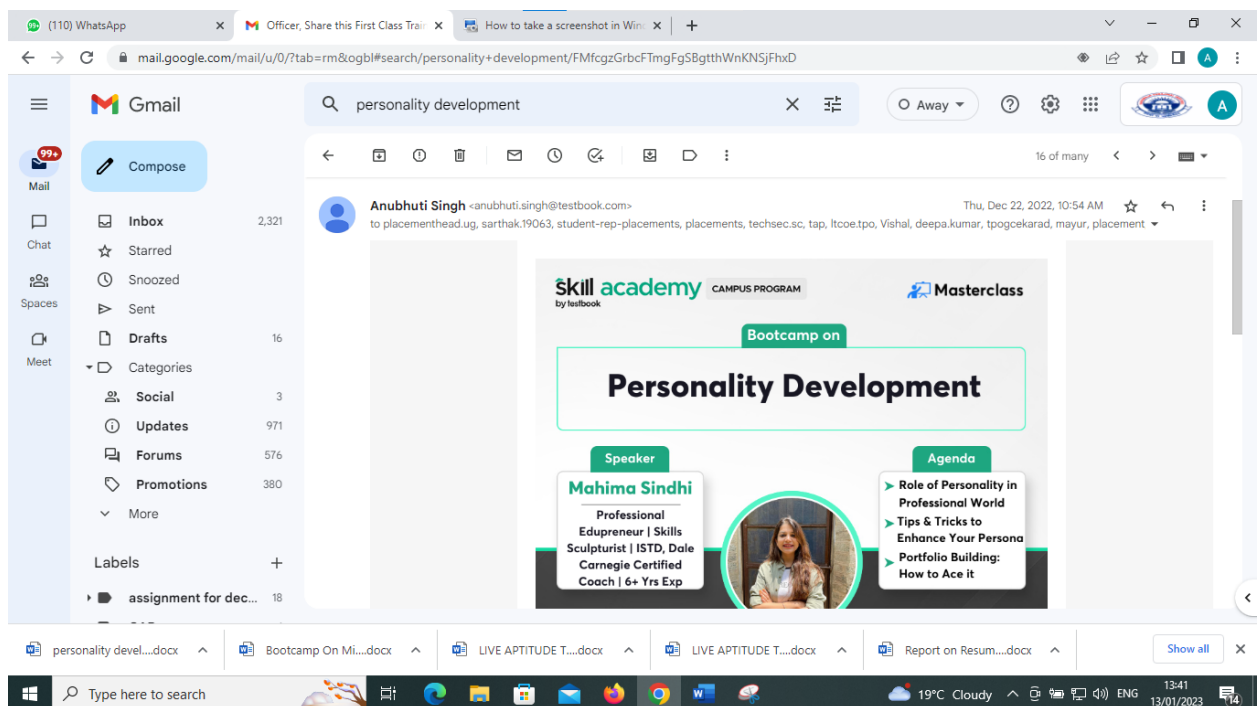

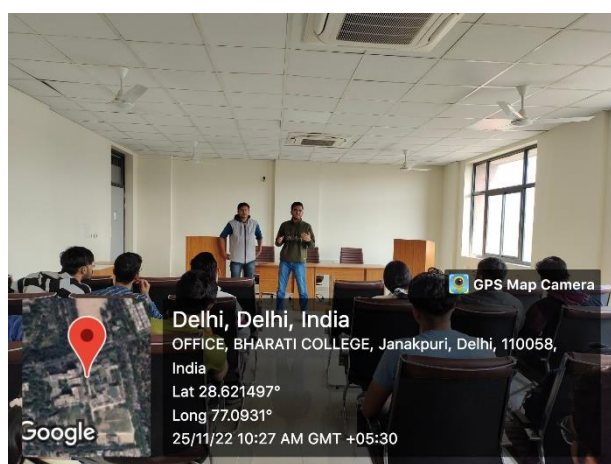
In all the session was a very informative and knowledgeable one . The students got to learn a lot which would help them to advance in their careers.

The session on Search Engine Optimization (SEO) was conducted on 29th December, 2022 by

He then discussed the meaning of Search engine optimization and explained in length the concept in the context of corporate .



Search engine optimization (SEO) is a process of optimizing a website to rank higher in search engine results pages (SERPs). The session that was conducted for students likely covered the following topics in depth:



1. **Keyword research:** Identifying relevant keywords and phrases that people use to search for products or services related to the website. This can be done using keyword research tools such as Google Keyword Planner, SEMrush, or Ahrefs. By understanding the keywords that are being used by their target audience, students can optimize their website's content, meta tags, and URLs to align with these keywords, making it more likely that their website will appear in search results for those keywords.
2. **On-page optimization:** Optimizing website content, such as title tags, meta descriptions, and header tags, to make them more search engine friendly. This includes ensuring that the website has a clear and logical structure, that the URLs are short and descriptive, and that the website is mobile-friendly. On-page optimization also includes making sure that website's content is high-quality, engaging and provides value to the audience.
3. **Technical SEO:** Optimizing the technical aspects of a website, such as the site structure, and URLs, to improve its visibility in search engines. This includes ensuring that the website is free of broken links and that it loads quickly, as well as ensuring that it is properly indexed by search engines. This process also includes making sure that the website is using the latest version of web technologies like HTML, CSS and JavaScript, and that it is following best practices for website development.



4. **Off-page optimization:** Building backlinks to a website to improve its authority and ranking. Backlinks are links from other websites that point to a website. The more backlinks a website has, the more authoritative it is considered to be. This process of building backlinks can be done by creating high-quality, shareable content, participating in online communities, and networking with other website owners.

5. **Analytics and reporting:** Using tools like Google Analytics to track website traffic, search engine rankings, and conversion rates. By understanding how people are interacting with their website, students can make data-driven decisions about how to improve it. This includes tracking website traffic, identifying where visitors are coming from, and understanding how they are interacting with the website.




By learning about these topics, students will be able to improve their website's visibility in search engines, attract more traffic, and ultimately benefit their own website or business. They will be better equipped to understand how search engines work, how to make their website more visible, and how to reach target audiences. They will be able to identify the areas that need improvement, and take appropriate actions to improve the website's performance. SEO is an ongoing process and the students will have a solid foundation to continuously improve their website's performance. They will be able to create a website that delivers value to the users, follows best practices and is easily discoverable by search engines. This will give them a competitive edge in the market and help them reach their target audience effectively. The session ended with the demo of SEO.

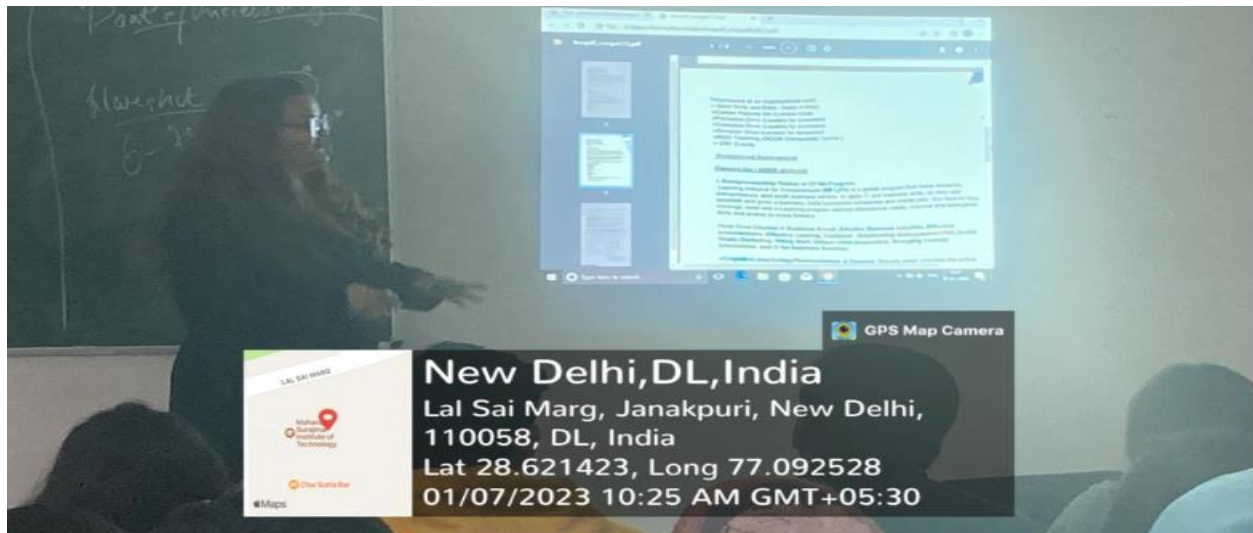

Those two chances are your cover letter and your CV. She explained the concept of cover letter that it's a letter that covers the key points in your experience and skill set that prove you're a great candidate for the job.

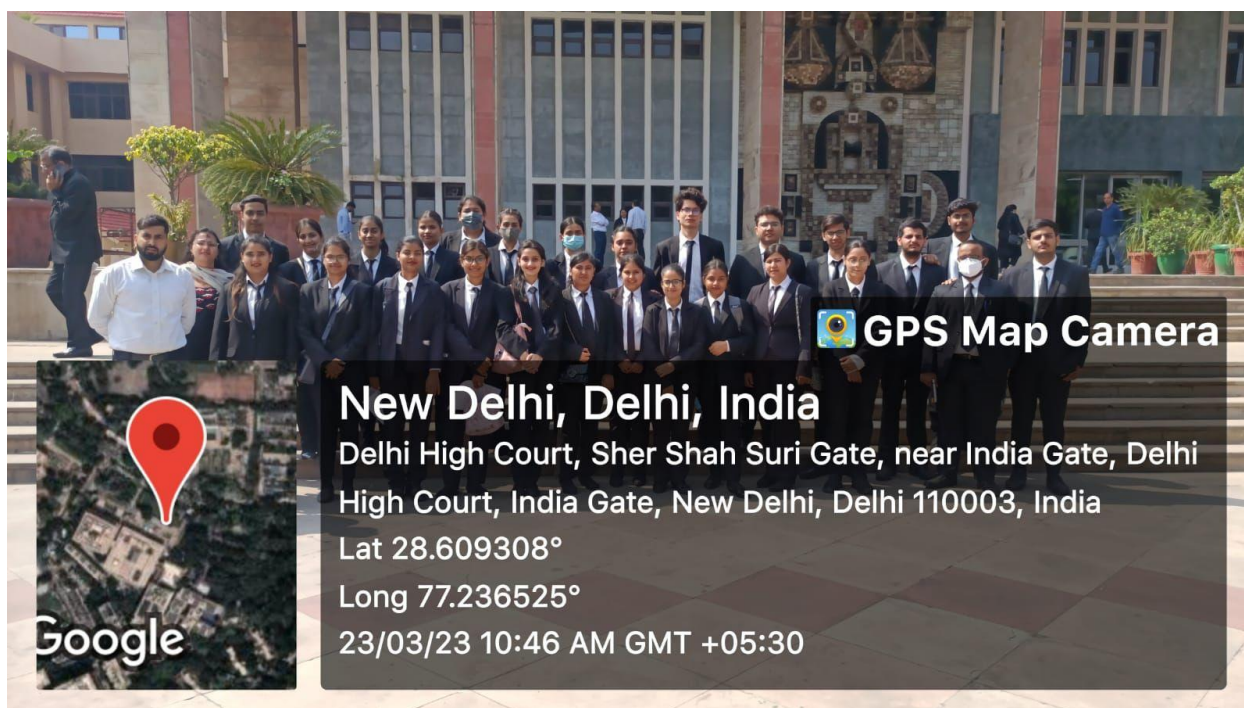

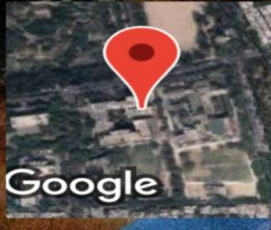

- **Final Round**

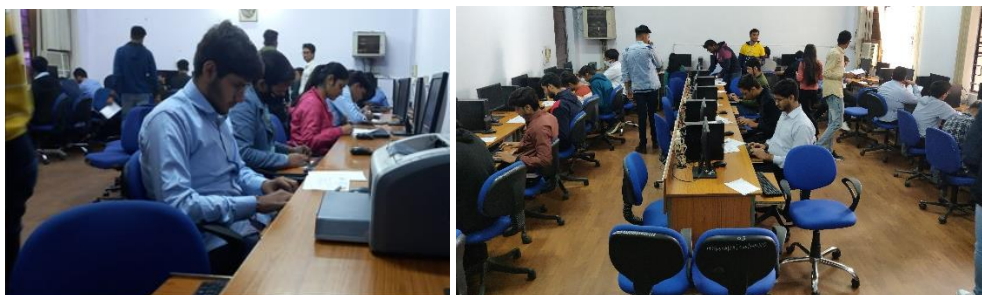

the respected Director, Prof. (Dr.) Harish Singh, in the presence of the BCA HODs, faculty members, and the CSI committee.



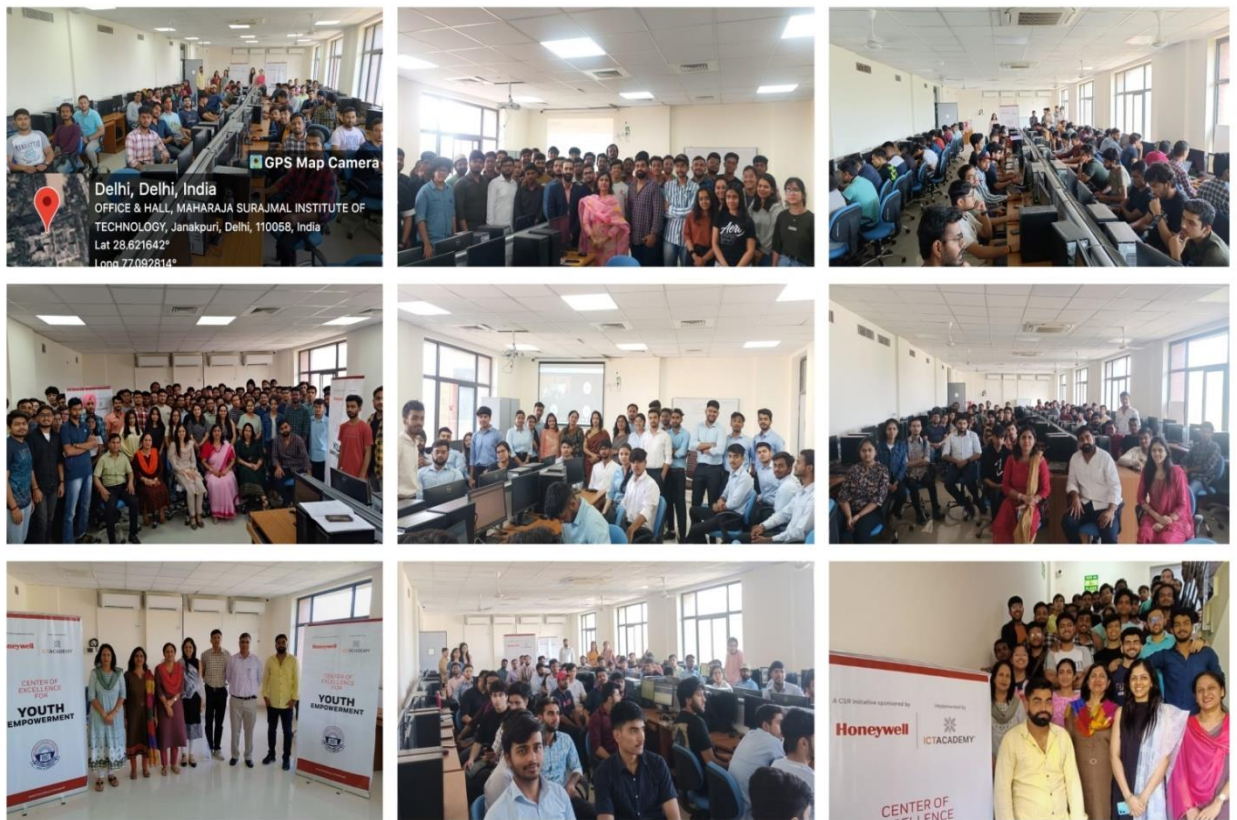

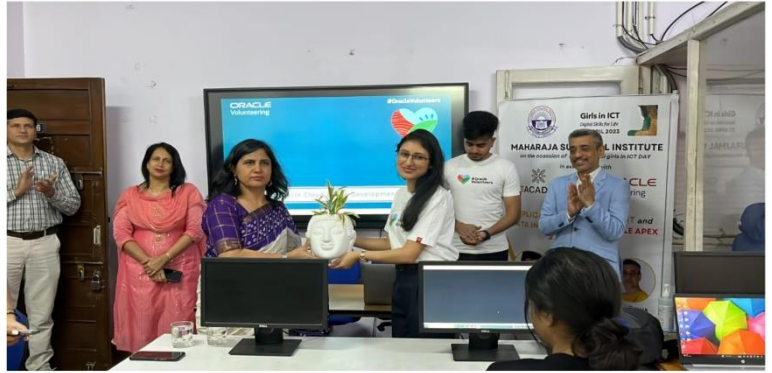

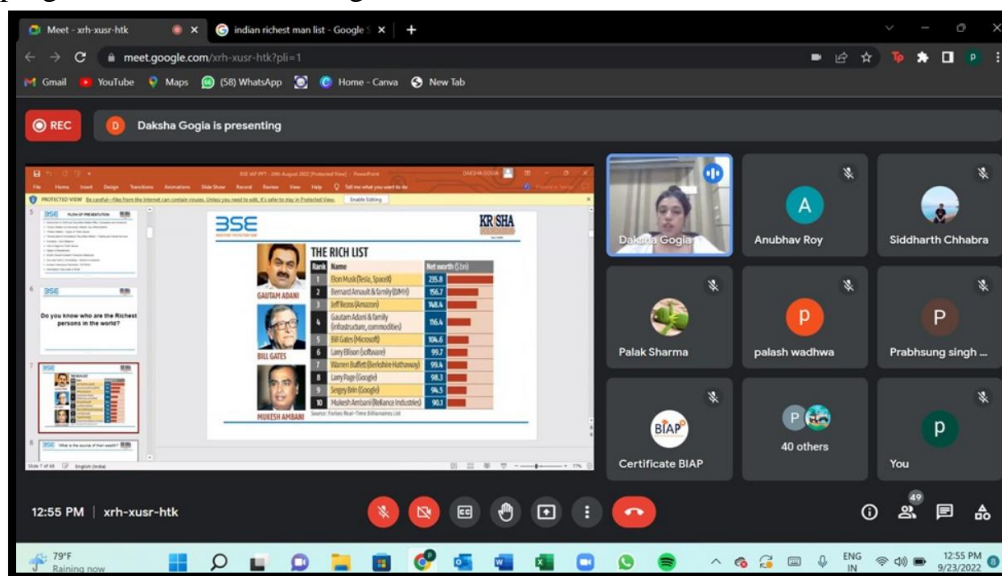
1. SESSION ON DEVELOPING AN ENTREPRENEURIAL MIND SET

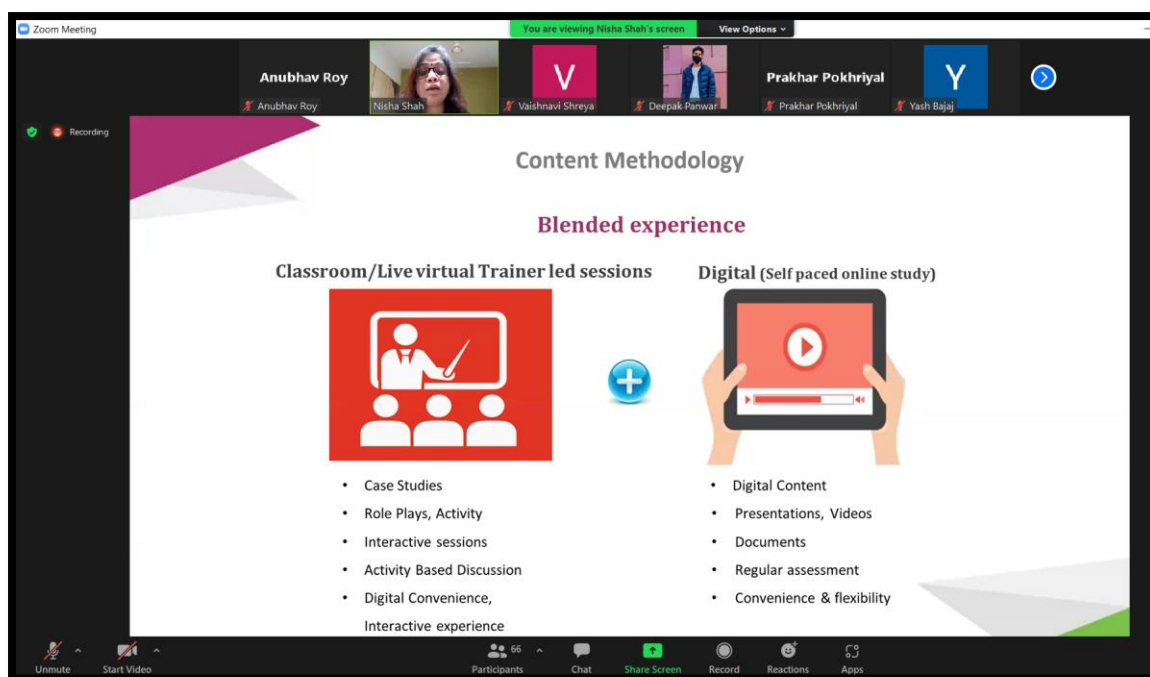

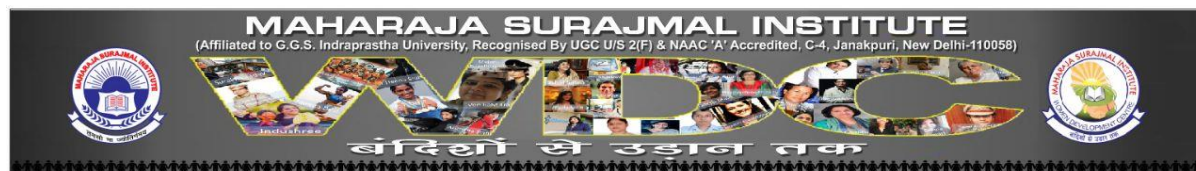

Project Veerangana took the initiative and held a donation drive in MSI-T on 27th and 28th March 2023 during college hours. Volunteers of Veerangana visited several classrooms for collecting the Donation money.



The donations were only accepted in the monetary

denominations, the minimum amount being Rs. 1, and maximum being as much as a student desired to donate.

The amount was collected in both online mode and offline mode.

Donations collected through the offline mode were done so by collecting the said amount in a donation box, a task which was under the purview of the volunteers.



For online payment collection, a QR code was posted on NSS MSI's social media handles, as well as provided to those in the college who were willing to pay through online mediums. The total amount collected was ₹10,535, with day one collections being ₹5165 and second day collections being ₹5370. The collected amount would then be used to purchase sanitary pads to be given to per-teen girls and teen girls in government schools. Requisite knowledge and information too was provided to the beneficiaries regarding the positives of using sanitary pads. All the information in regards to the day of distribution of pads and billings of the amount collected for purchasing the sanitary pads will be uploaded on NSS social handles to ensure transparency.

11. Sanitary Pad Donation Drive

PURPOSE OF DONATION DRIVE IS TO ORGANISE A SANITARY PAD DRIVE BY PROJECT VEERANGANA.

Project Veerangana under NSS MSI took the initiative to organize “Sanitary Pad Donation Drive” on 14th April, 2023 Friday.

Volunteers of Veerangana donated female hygiene products in slum areas near the college with the aim to spread awareness about menstrual hygiene.

"Menstruation is not a problem, poor menstrual hygiene is."

As the main aim of this donation drive was to spread awareness about menstrual hygiene.



In order to accomplish the aim the team members of Veerangana had a verbal interaction with the people which consisted of basic questions related to menstrual hygiene in order know if they had decent knowledge about it or not. The economic crisis that has arisen due to COVID-19 has created challenges for girls in the slums.

They are not able to afford a basic necessity like sanitary pads which has led to health and hygiene problems like UTI's and endometritis that not only cause daily discomfort but can also lead to cervical cancer, fibroids, and cysts that are often left unattended by the girls.

To address these issues, Project Veerangana put in place a drive to not only donate sanitary pads to girls but also

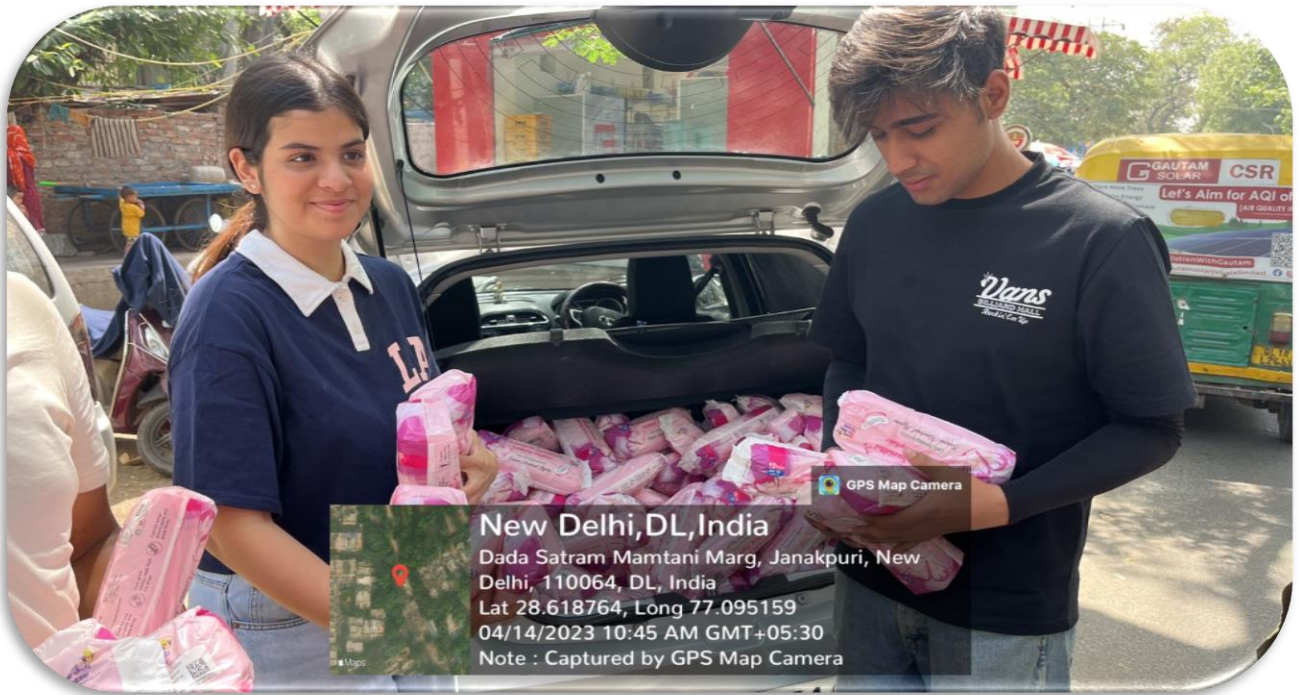
- explain the importance of using them (sanitary pads)
- consequences of not maintaining menstrual hygiene.

Each packet consisted of 10 pieces of Whisper (locally produced hygienic sanitary napkins).

distributed over 500 packets of sanitary napkins in slum areas. Each packet consisted of 10 pieces of Whisper (locally produced hygienic sanitary napkins). Each volunteer was provided 5 packets for the purpose of distribution. These packets were purchased from Pradhman Mantri Janaushadhi Kendra keeping in mind that there should be no compromise on the quality of product.

We hope to help these helpless girls in the best possible way we can. The drive not only helped the underprivileged with the donation but also raised awareness about menstruation and the urgency to uproot the hesitancy women and men feel in talking about it, considering it a taboo.

For the members of the Project Veerangana it was an opportunity to know about this side of these young girls' life, which has always been hidden under the veil of ignorance.

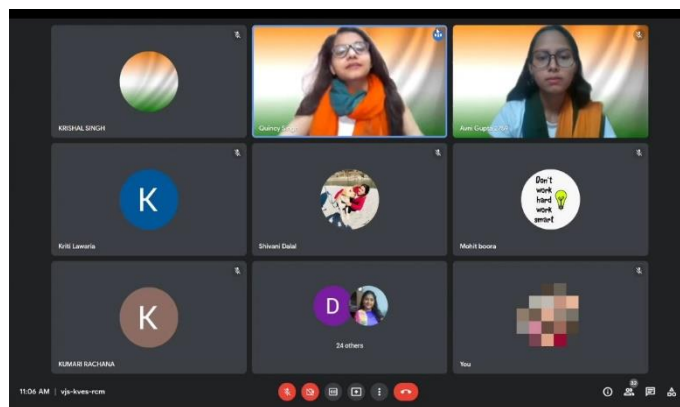

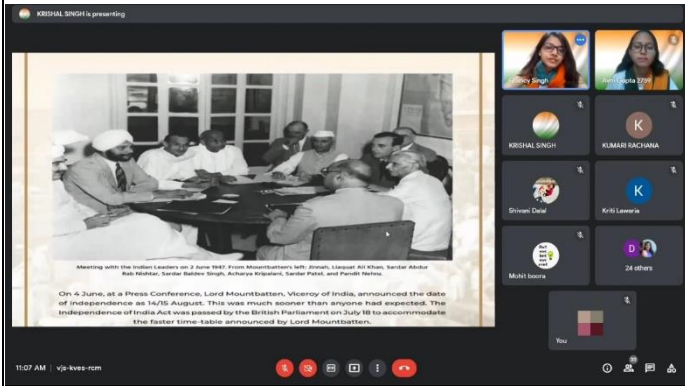
Quiz competition and exhibition on the occasion of Partition horrors remembrance day (august 14,2022)

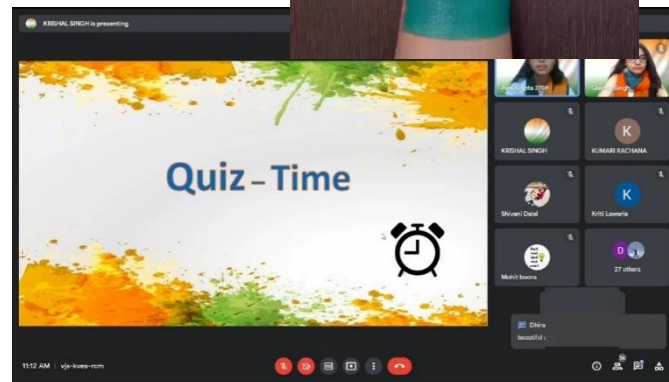
After that video was

September 27, 2022

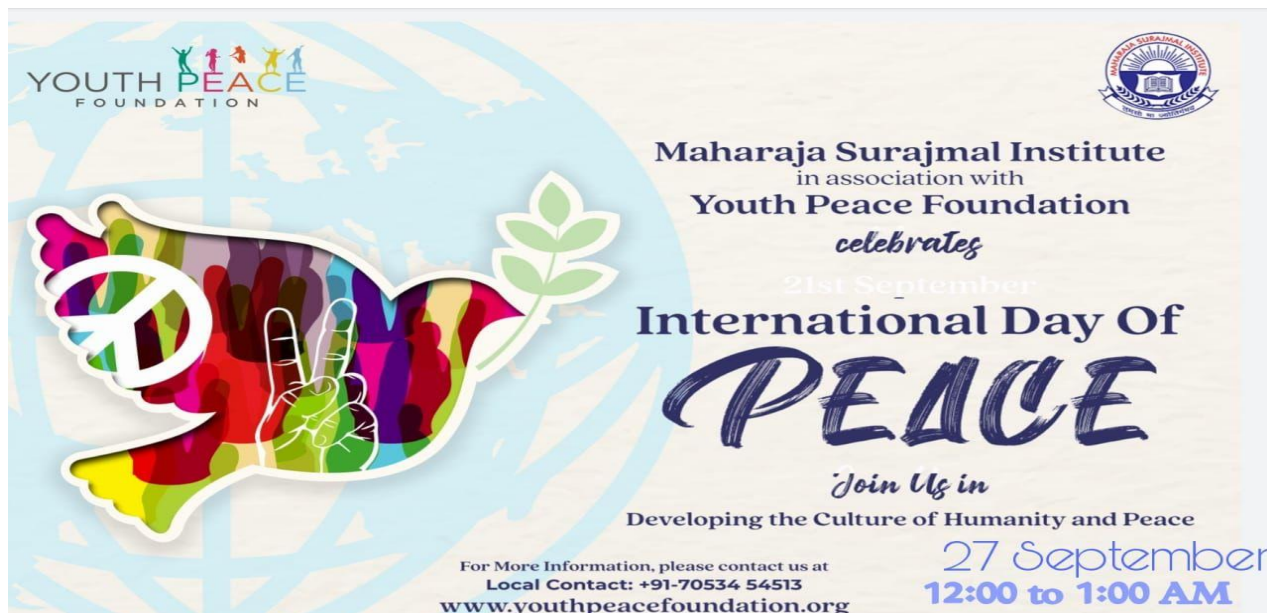

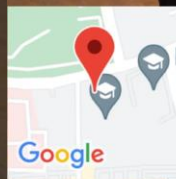
The session was concluded by a vote of thanks by Dr. Preeti Malik which was followed by the national anthem.

They are typically hunted for their flesh, skins, horns, and nails. Clothing, ropes, and many other useful products are made from skins. These animals are exclusively killed by humans to satisfy needless wants that can be satisfied in other ways. Therefore, wildlife conservation involves stopping indiscriminate poaching and slaughter of animal species. It is the unique strategy for safeguarding the planet's species and their habitat so that their future generations can live fearlessly..

By keeping that in mind **The Department of Business Administration, MSI in association with Nature Knocks: The Eco Club of Maharaja Surajmal Institute** has organised an

Article Writing Competition on the occasion of **wildlife week** and the topic for the competition was **“Protection and Preservation of Flora and Fauna of India”** from 4th to 8th of October through online mode. In which participants have to write interesting and fascinating Article.

Participants learnt the true value of Wildlife and need for the conservation of wildlife. They discovered the value of wildlife to both animals and people. These kinds of activities can support the development that minimises environmental problems.

RESTROING ECOLOGICAL BALANCE

Wild-life” means non-domesticated animals and uncultivated plants. It refers to magnificent fauna and flora in the jungle. Wild life management is concerned with the protection, propagation, and judicious control of population of rare species of animals and plants in their natural habitats.

During last 2000 years about 106 species of animals and 139 species of birds became extinct due to geographical & climatic changes and also due to human activity. Red Data Book lists about 600 species of animals at the verge of extinction.

Preservation of wild life is important because of following reasons:

1. Scientific value:

Scientific studies of wildlife species are important from academic point of view.

2. Commercial value:

Man depends on wildlife for many commercial products. The exploitation of wildlife resources has to be done with proper care and management.

3. Ecological value:

Destruction of wildlife may cause ecological imbalance. Protection of every organism is important to habitat preservation.

4. Game Value:

Hunting was a source of recreation and entertainment for Kings in olden days.

5. Asthetic value:

Wildlife is a source of “beauty”. It appeals to human thought spirit and imagination. It is a main attraction to tourists.

6. Ethical Value:

Man has no moral right to destroy wildlife. All religions preach a healthy respect to animals.

Cause of Wildlife Destruction:

There are two types of destruction of wildlife by man, direct and indirect.

Direct Destruction:

Many species are destroyed by man by hunting and capturing. Man also indiscriminately kill animals for entertainment, flesh, fur, feathers, trophies etc.

Indirect Destruction:

This is due to deforestation, destruction of natural habitat, spread of deserts, pollution, industrialization, insecticides, pesticides, herbicides etc.

Indian Wild Life:

India has varied climatic and geographical conditions with luxuriant tropical forests. Wildlife is unique by its richness and heterogeneity. Indian wildlife comprise about 350 species (30 families) of mammals, 2100 species (66 families) of birds and plenty of reptiles like lizards, snakes and turtles.

Methods of Preserving Wildlife:**1. Habitate preservation:**

This involves protection of wild life by biosphere reserve, protection and improvement of habitat.

2. Species preservation:

Nature reserves are usually designated in order to give protection to a species of plant or animal which is rare.

3. Breeding in captivity:

Some animals going to be extinct can be preserved by captive breeding.

4. Assemblage protection:

Most commonly an assemblage of species is protected. Delhi Zoo and Bharatpur Bird sanctuary are specially managed for assemblage of migratory birds. These places give maximum cover and food supply for migrating birds and to provide refuge from hunting.

5. Reintroduction:

The animals going to be extinct can be reintroduced to suitable places similar to the original habitat

6. Mass Education:

The common man should be educated the importance of wildlife and significance of its preservation.

Promulgation of Laws:

Poaching, capturing, killing and hunting wildlife can be prevented by wildlife protection acts.

Sanctuaries and National Parks in India:

These are the areas, declared by statute, for the purpose of protecting, propagating or developing wild life for their scientific, educational and recreational value. There exist differences between a sanctuary and a national park. In a sanctuary hunting without permit is prohibited and grazing or movement of cattle is regulated. In a national park hunting and grazing are absolutely prohibited.

At present, there 19 National parks and 202 sanctuaries scattered throughout India. They comprise a total area of about 75,000 sq. km. which roughly comes to 19% of reserve forest area and 2.3% total geographical area of the country. Sanctuaries and parks not only protect wildlife but safe guard varied ecosystem, prevent soil erosion and help in recycling of wastes. Many of them are accessible to the Indian as well as foreign tourists and therefore of economic value.

Areawise the largest is Ikshawaka sanctuary (Nagarjuna Sagar) in Andhra Pradesh covering 3568 sq. km. and smallest is Sultanpur (Lake) Bird sanctuary in Haryana covering 1.2 sq. km.

Protection by Legislation:

Most wild animals and plants inhabit forest areas. Any change in the forest environment in terms of food supply and other details would have a corresponding effect in their population.

Deforestation and poaching leads to destruction of wild life.

Appreciating the desirability of wildlife preservation, the India government enacted the Wild life Protection Act in 1972. The protected Indian wild life includes about 60 mammals, 11 birds and 6 reptiles. Despite the existence of this act, poaching (killing of game animals) is still a big national problem.

There are a large number of rural poachers active in the tarai belt of the Himalayas. These poachers shoot deer, wild bear, tiger, leopard and a variety of game birds. The meat of herbivore animals and the hides of the leopard and tiger are sold in market. Expensive purses and belts are made out of skin of snakes, crocodiles and the snow leopard.

IMPORTANCE OF CONSERVATION

The flora and fauna in India are different from a collection of plants and animals. The famous fauna of India incorporates 500 distinct collections of well-evolved mammals, 2000 types of birds, 30.000 sorts of bugs, and a few collections of fish, creatures of land and water, and reptiles.

- India is, as a matter of fact, one of the world's most extravagant nations in the wording of its huge swath of organic variety. This is conceivably two times or threefold the number yet to be found.
- A few evaluations propose that at any rate 10% of India's recorded wild verdure also, 20% of its vertebrates are on the compromised list. Large numbers of these would presently be classified as 'basic'.
- That is on the edge of elimination like the cheetah, pink-headed duck, mountain quail, and timberland spotted.
- Nobody can say the number of, truth be told species that might have previously been lost.

Vanishing Forest

- The forests and tree cover in the Indian nation are assessed at 807276 sq. km which is 24.56 percent of the complete topographical region(thick timberland 12.4 percent; open forest 9.26 percent; and mangrove 0.15 percent).

The International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources has classified six existing species, they are following:

- **Extinct Species:** These are species that are not found after searches of known or possible regions where they might happen. Animal categories might be terminated from a neighborhood, nation, mainland, or the whole earth. Examples of such species are the Asiatic cheetah and pink head duck.
- **Rare Species:** Species with little populace might move into the imperiled or on the other hand weak class if the negative variables influence them to keep on working. Examples of such species are the Himalayan earthy colored bear, wild Asiatic bison, desert fox furthermore, hornbill, and so forth.

- **Normal Species:** The populace level of species viewed as typical for their endurance, like dairy cattle, sal, pine, rodents, and so forth.
- **Endemic Species:** These are species that are just found in a few specific regions typically secluded by normal or geological boundaries. Examples of such species are the Nicobar pigeon, Andaman wild pig, and Mithun in Arunachal Pradesh.
- **Vulnerable Species:** The species which are most susceptible to being endangered in near future are known as vulnerable species. Examples are one-horned Rhinoceros, blackbuck, and so forth.
- **Endangered Species:** These are species that are at risk of annihilation. The endurance of such species is troublesome if the negative factors that have prompted a downfall in their populace keep on working. Examples of such species are a dark buck, crocodile, Indian wild ass, Indian rhino, lion followed macaque, sangria, and so forth.

Factors Responsible for Depletion

There are various factors that have prompted the depletion of flora and fauna. Are shifting cultivation, mining activities, large scale development projects, and overpopulation, are the main cause and many more are explained below

- Unnecessary utilization of regular assets for satisfying human necessities like wood, barks, leaves, elastic, meds, colors, food, fuel, grub, fertilizer, and so forth.
- The forest ecosystem is vaults of a portion of the country's most important timberland items, minerals, and different assets that satisfy the needs of the quickly growing modern metropolitan economy.
- Mining is another important factor behind deforestation. It has upset the regular environment of numerous species and impeded the relocation course of several others, including the incomparable Indian elephant

- Hunting is broad administrator of loss of biodiversity.
Hunting exercises apply an extensive weight on natural life, inciting massive slump of natural life and prompting upset and wasteful biological systems.
- Air contaminations like ash, residue, alkali, or carbon dioxide can straightforwardly and in a roundabout way impact biodiversity.
- Environmental change, close to different parts, for example, living space misfortune, land debasement, hunting, overexploitation of specific species and so forth, is turning up as a high danger to biodiversity.

CONSERVATION OF WILDLIFE

A vast, interrelated system of biotic and abiotic factors makes up an ecosystem. All living species, including plants, animals, and bacteria, are considered biotic components. Abiotic components, on the other hand, are non-living entities that are necessary for life to survive, such as soil, water, and climate. Flora and Fauna are the most intriguing of all biotic components.

Flora is the collective name for all plant life that exists or ever grew in a specific region or at a specific time. It typically refers to the existing native plant life, but it may also apply to newly imported species.

The term **fauna** simply refers to all of the creatures that live in a certain area. All interconnected species, from pheasants to vultures, mammals from mice to bison, worms to reptiles, insects, soil and water fauna, and so on, belong under the category of **fauna**.

India's flora and fauna are diversified, having a wide range of plant and animal species. India's famous fauna comprises 500 distinct animal species, 2000 bird species, 30.000 insect species, and a variety of fish, amphibians, and reptiles. Elephants, Royal Bengal Tigers, rhinos, bison, and lions are some of the country's most prevalent animals.

The Alpines, temperate woods, deciduous forests, evergreen forests, oaks, rhododendrons, pine, spruce, deodar, laurels, maples, bamboos, and tall grasses are among the flora found in India.

To conserve the wildlife or protect flora and Fauna, government has taken many initiatives. Some of the initiatives programmes are :

1. To prevent flora and fauna, the Government has set up 18 biosphere reserves.
2. In the world's network of biosphere reserves, 10 out of these 18 biosphere reserves like the Sundarbans in the West Bengal, Nanda Devi in Uttarakhand, the gulf of Mannar in Tamil Nadu and the Nilgiris (Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu) have been included.
3. Since 1992 Government has given full support by providing financial and technical assistance to many Botanical Gardens.
4. Many eco-development projects have been started by the government to protect the Flora and Fauna such as Project Tiger, Project Rhinos, Project Great Indian Bustard etc.
5. In 1972, India has implemented Wild Protection Act.
Other ways to conserve –
 1. Plant and animal habitat needs to be safeguarded
 2. Humans should spent less time on animal and plants.

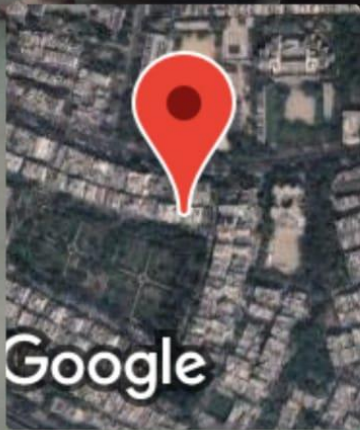

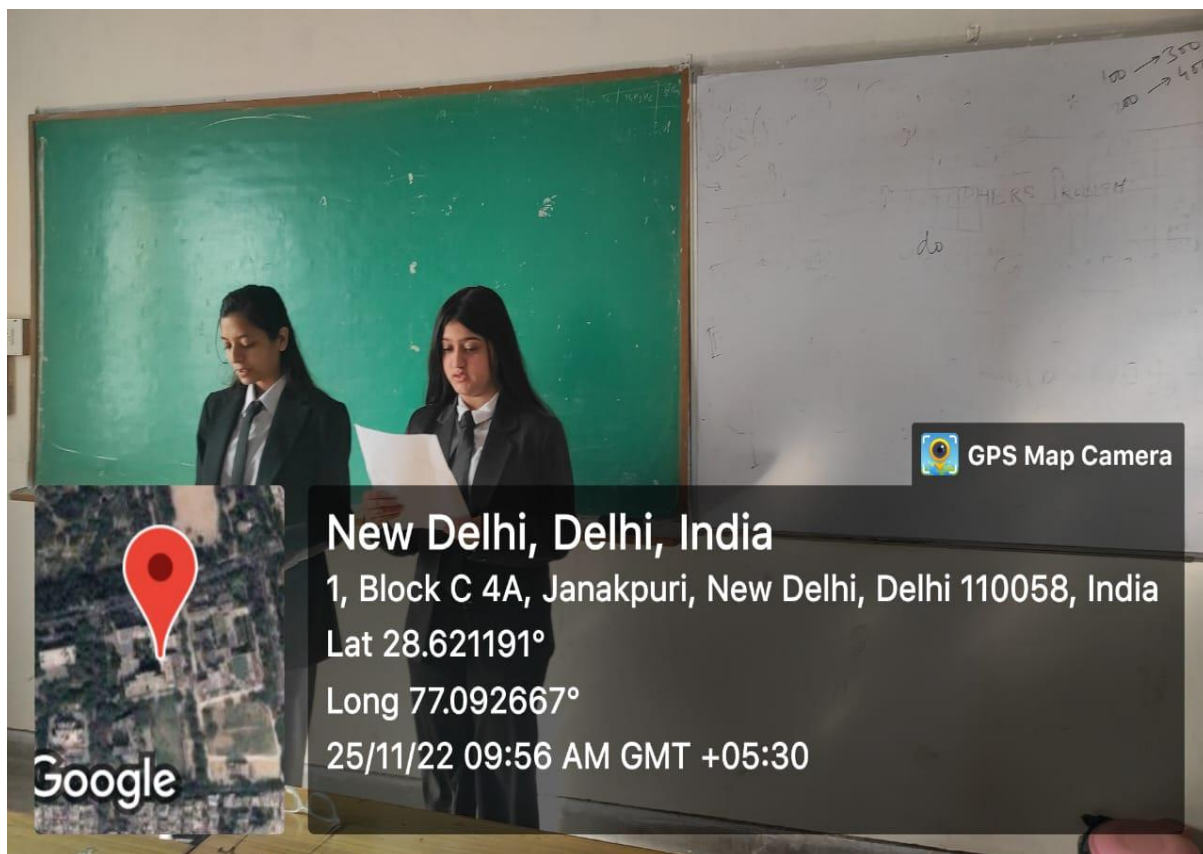

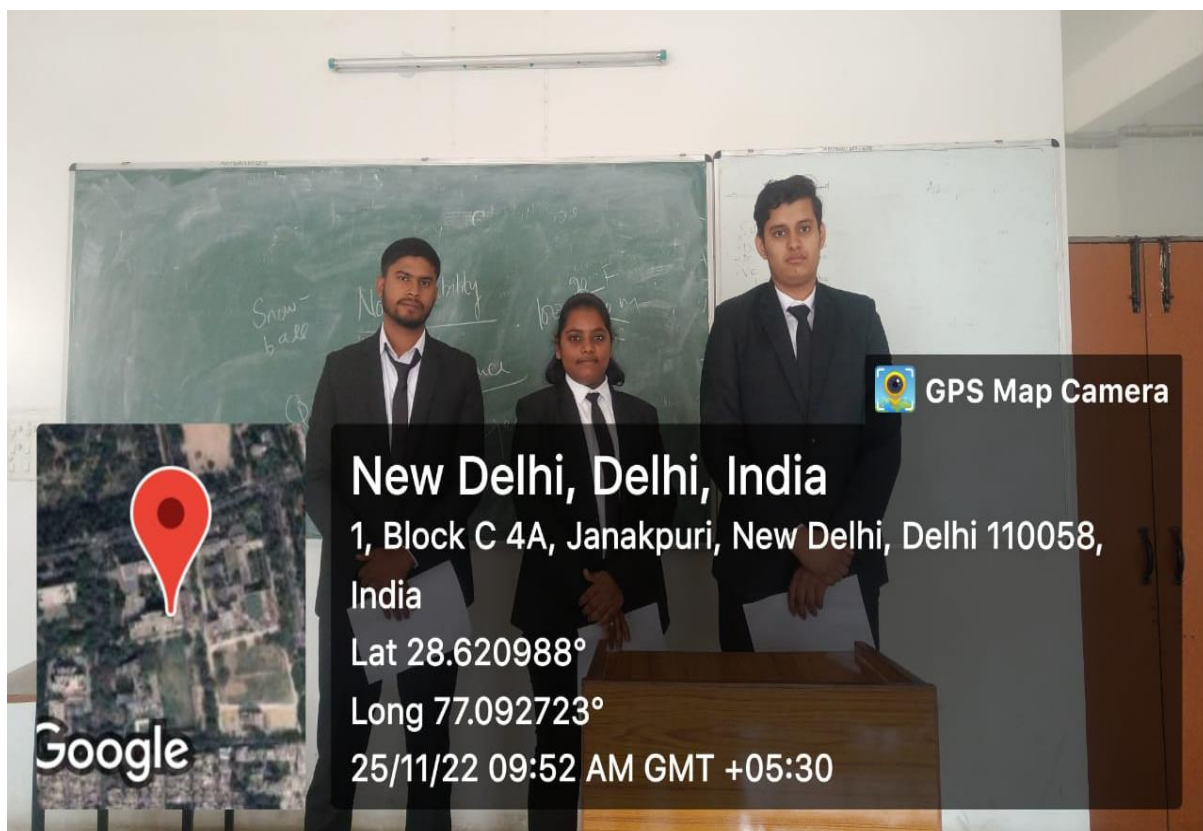
17. Reciting Preamble and Fundamental duties

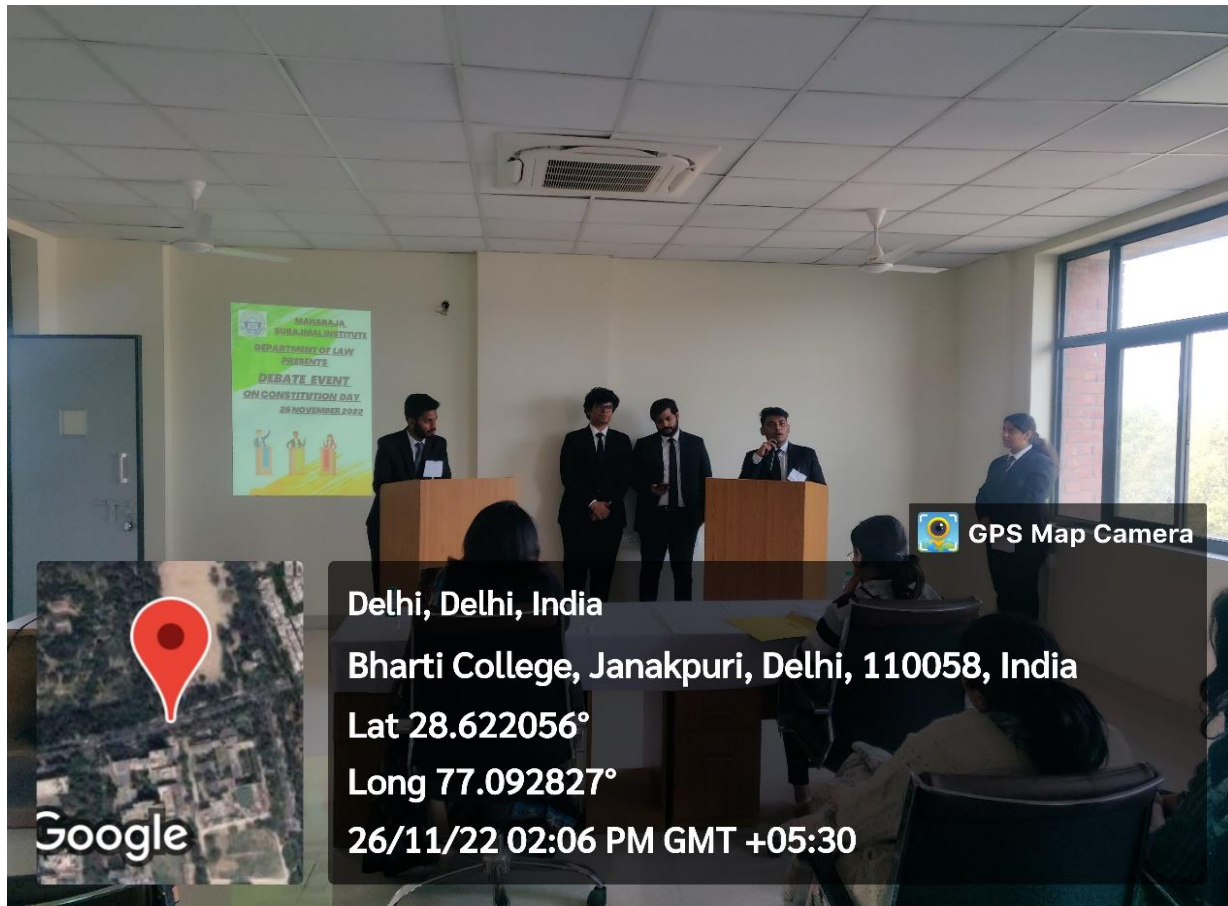
DEBATE EVENT **ON CONSTITUTION DAY** **26 NOVEMBER 2022**

34. REPORT ON 'NOISE POLLUTION'

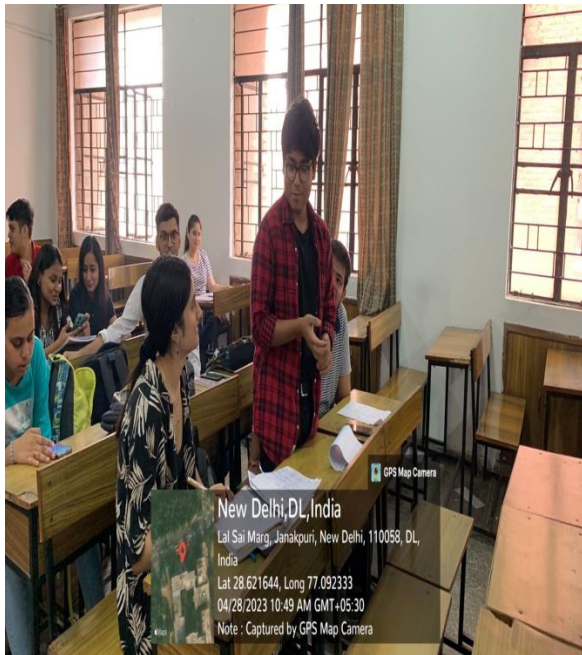
